SUBJECT: County of Santa Barbara, Local Coastal Program Amendment 2-96-C. Concurrence with Executive Director's determination that the action by the County of Santa Barbara accepting certification of Amendment 2-96-C to the County's Local Coastal Program is legally adequate.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S DETERMINATION AND REPORT FOR COMMISSION REVIEW AT THE MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 9, 1997

Background

Local Coastal Program Amendment 2-96 was separated into three components. Part A addressed the Summerland Community Plan, Part B incorporated policies and implementation measures concerning oil and gas development via slant-drilling along the Gaviota Coast, and Part C incorporated a voter-approval initiative known as Measure A96 into the County's Land Use Plan and Coastal Zoning Ordinance. Measure A96 requires voter approval of County legislative approvals authorizing new or expanded onshore energy facilities for offshore oil and gas projects (unless sited within the consolidated sites at Gaviota and Las Flores Canyons).

On May 14, 1997, the Commission certified Part C without modifications. On June 17, 1997, the Santa Barbara County Board of Supervisors acknowledged the Commission's certification of LCP Amendment 2-96-C.

As provided for in Section 13544 of the Commission's Administrative Regulations, the Executive Director must determine that the action of Santa Barbara County is legally adequate and report that determination to the Commission.

Recommendation: That the Commission concur with the Executive Director's determination that the action of the Board of Supervisors of Santa Barbara County accepting the certification of LCP Amendment #2-96-C, as submitted, is legally adequate.
