WHEREAS, based on the recommendations of a citizen's task force and substantial community and stakeholder input, a Phase III Expansion of the current facility is being proposed to meet market demand, address lost business concerns and build on the success of the current facility while also generating new jobs and regional economic benefits; and

WHEREAS, the Phase III Expansion will attract an additional 25 primary events and nearly 250,000 additional attendees which will create positive regional economic impacts of \$689 Million and 6,685 new permanent jobs; and

WHEREAS, the Phase III Expansion will also create a new five-acre elevated public park and substantial retail uses to activate and create a visitor destination on the Bayfront; and

WHEREAS, the Phase III Expansion will maximize and greatly enhance public access and public recreational opportunities for San Diegans as well as visitors on the Bayfront consistent with the California Coastal Act; and

WHEREAS, the Phase III Expansion, its economic impacts, its proposed location and its public realm amenities have the enthusiastic support of neighborhoods surrounding the proposed Phase III Expansion, the greater San Diego region and diverse business and labor organizations.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Santee, California, that this Council hereby affirms its support for the Phase III Expansion of the San Diego Convention Center and urges the California Coastal Commission to approve the project at its October hearing.

Up to 7,000 new permanent jobs will be created by this project, plus the thousands of jobs generated during the construction process. It is projected that over \$12.7 million in new annual Transient Occupancy Tax (TOT) revenues will be generated for the City's General Fund, plus up to \$1 million in new Sales Tax revenues.



I am writing you in support of the proposed Port Master Plan Amendment for the expansion of the San Diego Convention Center and Hilton Bayfront Hotel submitted by the San Diego Unified Port District. To be clear, our neighborhood understands the commercial importance of this project, but we feel the greater positive impacts will come from the almost 42,000 square feet of new visitor-serving uses that would be added to a new public promenade along the San Diego waterfront.

The Gaslamp Quarter Association has been the voice of the historic commercial district for decades and we have seen first-hand which projects enliven a waterfront and a community. Starting in 1850, when Alonzo Horton built his pier at the end of Fifth Avenue, we have been the welcoming point to immigrants, visitors and commerce. Our neighborhood has thrived and suffered based on past decisions that either enhanced or limited our connection to the waterfront. Nobody can deny the benefits of the placement of the Convention Center in its current location and the opportunities that will occur from the increase public areas/access.

In our view, the proposed expansion will enhance public access and offer visitors and local residents a unique opportunity to view San Diego Bay as it has never been seen before: from a 5-acre public park atop the Convention Center. Not to mention the benefits gained from the environmentally sustainable design that incorporates elements to meet LEED certification, unique rooftop landscaping that will filter and clean water that would otherwise be pumped into a sanitary sewer, and a state-of-the-art storm-water retention and filtration system that will minimize water demand from the city system.

The new promenade will improve connectivity to Embarcadero Marina Park South along the bayside of the Convention Center to the Gaslamp Quarter and the rest of Downtown.
