We are seeking a detail-oriented volunteer for our Public Education Program, assisting with the Coastal Art & Poetry Contest for K-12 students. The bulk of the work will take place between January 27, 2020 and April 10, 2020, in downtown San Francisco, conveniently located near the BART Embarcadero Station. This is an unpaid, part-time position with flexible hours, 8-16 hours per week.

**Background:** The Coastal Commission is a State agency charged with protecting coastal resources and managing coastal development in California. The Coastal Commission's Public Education Program works to increase public knowledge of coastal and marine resources and to engage the public in coastal protection and restoration activities.
