A. <u>PROJECT DESCRIPTION</u> The project is finalizing the City's comprehensive update to the Local Coastal Program and conducting environmental impact studies necessary for the Coastal Commission's environmental review. The City has been working on its comprehensive update to the LCP for a number of years. In recent years, the City has obtained Coastal Commission assistance to finalize a revised LCP to replace the current LCP, which was adopted just over three-decades ago. The Draft Land Use Plan (LUP) is nearly ready for submission. However, the Implementation Plan (IP) and associated zoning is in rough draft form and nearing completion. This project would complete the IP and allow the City to finalize public review of the draft LCP.

The City will adopt its LCP update using the CEQA statutory exemption. However, the Coastal Commission will require special studies of the City to process the functional equivalent environmental review. The City will conduct or contract for preparation of studies, including a sea level rise adaptation plan, environmental analysis of proposed amendments in land use designations, greenhouse gas, hazards and hazardous materials, and other special studies necessary for the Commission's environmental determination on the LCP. The special studies will be submitted along with the special studies to support the City's LCP major amendment application.

This grant will facilitate the City completing this work for timely submission to update the significantly out-of-date LCP.

B. <u>TASKS</u>

- 1. Task Descriptions and Schedule.
 - a. Task Descriptions:

Task 1: Environmental Scoping

<u>1.1 Noticed Public Scoping Meeting</u> – The City will hold a noticed public scoping meeting to seek input on potential environmental impacts from the public. The scoping will focus on the potential environmental impacts of the LCP update. Public input will be used to identify the special studies necessary to conduct environmental review for the plan amendment. The City will use both broad notice (legal notice, list serve notification, social media posts) and targeted notice (email to interested parties/stakeholders, direct mail to property owners and residences/businesses) to generate interest in the scoping. Engagement will include outreach to disadvantaged and low-income communities living in the coastal zone. In addition, the City will involve the three area Wiyot Tribes early in this process through informal consultation with the Tribal Heritage Preservation Officers. In addition, the City will create a stipend-based stakeholder engagement to ensure racially diverse participation among disadvantaged communities, lower-income individuals, and marginalized groups. The City will receive scoping comments in writing and orally at the scoping meeting. This subtask informs the overall goal with broad and equitable outreach.

a. Deliverable: Scoping report with summary of comments received and whether/how the comments were incorporated. The report will include written comments received. The report will be finalized after Coastal Commission and City staff review (see below). This process will also add to the City's e-mail list of interested parties.

<u>1.2 Request for Agency Comments</u> – The City will solicit written scoping comments from responsible state and local agencies.

b. Deliverable: Agency responses.

<u>1.3 Coastal Commission & City Staff Review</u> – Coastal Commission and City Staff will consider the scoping comments from the public, stakeholders, and agencies to address any special studies that will be necessary to complete environmental review. This subtask ensures the project will provide the studies the Coastal Commission requires.

c. Deliverable: List of special studies to be conducted, including any new studies identified during scoping that were not included prior to scoping. Participants in the scoping will be notified when the list is available.

Task 2: Special Studies

<u>2.1 Administrative Drafts</u> – The City, or its contracted agent, will prepare the special studies identified in the special studies list based on scoping. This task initiates the studies needed for environmental review.

a. Deliverable: Draft special studies.

<u>2.2 Coastal Commission and City Staff Review</u> - Coastal Commission and City Staff will review the administrative drafts of the special studies and provide comment, if any, for revision. This subtask provides quality control on the ultimate deliverable.

b. Deliverable: mark-up administrative draft special studies.

<u>2.3 Revise Drafts</u> - The City, or its contracted agent, will revise the special studies based on Coastal and City staff review. This subtask completes the quality control initiated in the previous subtask.

c. Deliverable: revised draft special studies available on City's LCP website with notification to interested parties.

Task 3: Draft LCP

<u>3.1 Public Review Draft LCP</u> – The City, or its contracted agent, will prepare a Draft LCP for public review. The City will meet regularly with Coastal Commission staff during the development of the LCP as scheduling allows.

a. Deliverable: Draft LCP for public review.

<u>3.2 Stakeholder Meeting</u> – The City will hold stakeholder meetings on the Draft LCP. Meetings will include a mix of on-line and in-person workshops, Planning Commission meetings, and small group stakeholder meetings. The purpose will include seeking input on the Draft from agencies and the public. Outreach will include the steps identified in the scoping Noticed Public Scoping Meeting subtask. Salient public and agency input will be used to modify the Draft LCP. Input that is not used to modify the document will be included in a report with information why it was not included. This subtask maintains transparency and accountability for the project.

b. Deliverable: meeting notes, minutes, and staff reports.

<u>3.3 Revised Draft LCP</u> - The City, or its contracted agent, will revise the LCP based on the Stakeholder Meeting. This subtask produces the document that is the stated goal of the project.

c. Deliverable: Revised Draft LCP.

<u>3.4 LCP Major Amendment Submittal</u> – The City will locally adopt the LCP and submit an application to the Coastal Commission for a major amendment to the LCP to effectively comprehensively revise the current LCP.

a. Deliverable: local approval hearings.

b. *Deliverable*: submittal of an application to the Coastal Commission.

- 7. The term "Grant Manager"; the representative of the Commission with authorization per the Executive Director to administer and provide oversight of the Grant.
- 8. The term "Grantee"; an applicant who has a signed agreement for Grant Funds.
- 9. The term "Project"; the activity described under the Scope of Work, attached as EXHIBIT A, to be accomplished with Grant Funds.
- 10. The term "Project Budget"; the Commission approved cost estimate submitted to the Commission's Grant Manager for the Project. The Project Budget shall describe all labor and material costs of completing each component of the Project.
