There is unlikely a simple legal solution to provide certainty to property owners, regulators, and jurisdictions in the near term.</li> <li>Sea level rise predictions and risk assessments are improving. However, uncertainty about the timing, location and intensity of impacts will remain.</li> <li>Parcel-by-parcel planning, permitting and projects result in sub-optimal solutions and costly processes for most or all involved.</li> <li>All adaptation strategies have secondary impacts.</li> <li>Phased and locally specific approaches are required for better progress on adaptation planning and Local Coastal Program (LCP) updates.</li> </ol> </li> </ol>
