other artwork, and no other hands were involved in the production. Entrants may rely on photographs or published images as guides (e.g. of a California native species), but the end product must be significantly different. The entry must be the entrant's own creation and idea.

GUIDELINES

- 1. This contest is open to California residents in grades K-12. (Immediate family members of CCC staff are not eligible.) There are five grade categories for awards in both art and poetry: K-1, 2-3, 4-6, 7-9, and 10-12. Entries must have a California coastal or California marine theme (e.g. no tropical or artic settings or species). Winners will be selected for art and poetry in each of the grade categories; winners will receive a \$100 gift certificate to an art supply or book store. Each winner's teacher (named on the Entry Form) will receive a \$50 gift certificate for educational supplies. Entries may be submitted via a teacher or individually without teacher assistance.
- 2. Poems and artwork must be student's original work. If using a photo model taken by someone else, image must be significantly altered to avoid plagiarism. Artwork should not be traced from another artist's work, and no hands other than the student's own should be involved in the creation of the artwork. Poetry must be either typed or legibly written in ink. Poems should be printed on the back of the completed Entry Form (preferred) or stapled to the Entry Form. Artwork may not exceed 11 x 17 inches in size. Acceptable art media are paint, pencil, markers, ink, crayon, chalk or pastel (fixed), and collage. Three-dimensional pieces, printouts, photography, or photocopies are not eligible. Art must contain name, grade and school on the back and are encouraged to include a short Statement about artist's inspiration. Attach completed Entry Form and Statement to back of each piece of artwork. Please do not fold artwork or use paperclips.
- 3. Through submission of poetry or artwork, contestants and their legal guardians grant to the CCC non-exclusive reproduction and publication rights to the works submitted.
- 4. All entries must be postmarked by January 31. Students may enter multiple pieces. Multiple entries (whether from one student or from a group) can be sent in one package, but each entry must have its own entry form attached. The CCC is not responsible for entries that are late, damaged, or lost. Winners will be directly contacted and announced at www.coastforyou.org by April 2018.
- 5. If you would like to have your artwork returned to you, include adequate postage and address label for reuse of original packaging (preferred) or a self-addressed, stamped envelope of the correct size. Entries that do not include these items at the time of submittal can not be returned. You must PAY for any USPS envelopes you enclose and make sure the post office marks them as PAID. We can no longer cover the cost of unpaid USPS packaging. Multiple entries may be returned in one package. Poetry will not be returned. Winning and honorably mentioned artwork may be retained by the CCC for approximately one year for public exhibit.
