## TEXT OF PROPOSED CHANGES Coastal Commission Regulations, Title 14, Section 13012

§ 13012. Major Public Works and Energy Facilities

(a) "Major public works" and "Major energy facilities" mean facilities that cost more than \$341,677\$348,398 with an automatic annual increase in accordance with the Engineering News Record (ENR) Construction Cost Index, except for those governed by the provisions of Public Resources Code Sections 30610, 30610.5, 30611 or 30624.

### TEXT OF PROPOSED CHANGES Coastal Commission Regulations, Title 14, Section 13055

#### § 13055. Fees.

- (a) Filing fees for processing coastal development permit applications shall be as follows:
  - (1) \$3,820\$3,923 for any development qualifying for an administrative permit.
  - (2) (A) For up to 4 detached, single-family residences the fee for each residence shall be based on the square footage of the proposed residence as shown in the following table:

Square Footage of Proposed Residence	Fee	
1500 or less	\$4,584 <u>\$4,707</u>	
1501 to 5000	<del>\$6,876</del> <u>\$7,061</u>	
5001 to 10,000	<del>\$9,168</del> <u>\$9,414</u>

- (B) For more than 4 detached, single-family residences, the fee shall be as follows:
  - 1. For residences of 1500 square feet or less, the fee shall be \$22,920\\$23,535 or \\$1,528\\$1,569 per residence, whichever is greater, but not to exceed \\$152,800\\$156,900;
  - 2. For residences of 1501 to 5000 square feet, the fee shall be \$34,380\\$35,303 or \$2,292\\$2,354 per residence, whichever is greater, but not to exceed \$152,800\\$156,900;

- 3. For residences of 5001 to 10,000 square feet, the fee shall be \$45,840\\$47,070 or \$3,056\\$3,138 per residence, whichever is greater, but not to exceed \$152,800\\$156,900;
- 4. For residences of 10,001 or more square feet, the fee shall be \$57,300\\$58,838 or \$3,820\\$3,923 per residence, whichever is greater, but not to exceed \$152,800\\$156,900.

For developments that include residences of different sizes, the fee shall be based upon the average square footage of all the residences.

- (C) As used herein, the term "square footage" includes gross internal floor space of the main house and attached garage(s), plus any detached structures (e.g., guest houses, detached bedrooms, in-law units, garages, barns, art studios, tool sheds, and other outbuildings.)
- (3) (A) For up to 4 attached residential units the fee shall be \$11,460\$11,768.
  - (B) For more than 4 attached residential units, the fee shall be \$15,280\\$15,690 or \$1,146\\$1,177 per unit, whichever is greater, but not to exceed \$76,400\\$78,450.
- (4) All projects that include more than 50 cubic yards of grading shall be subject to an additional fee as shown on the following table:

This fee does not apply to residential projects that qualify for administrative permits.

(5) For office, commercial, convention, or industrial (including energy facilities as defined in Public Resources Code section 30107) development, and for all other development not otherwise identified in this section, the fee shall be based upon either the gross square footage as shown in (5)(A) or the development cost as shown in (5)(B), whichever is greater.

## (A) Fees based upon gross square footage shall be as follows:

## (B) 1. Fees based upon development cost shall be as follows:

- 2. As used herein, the term "development cost" includes all expenditures, including the cost for planning, engineering, architectural, and other services, made or to be made for designing the project plus the estimated cost of construction of all aspects of the project both inside and outside the Commission's jurisdiction.
- (6) \$1,528\\$1,569 for immaterial amendments to coastal development permits, and fifty percent (50%) of the permit fee that would currently apply to the permitted development for material amendments to coastal development permits.
- (7) \$1,528\\$1,569 for emergency permits. A fee paid for an emergency permit shall be credited toward the fee charged for the follow-up coastal development permit.
- (8) \$3,820\\$3,923 for temporary events that require a permit, unless the application is scheduled on the administrative calendar, in which case the fee shall be \$1,528\\$1,569.
- (b) Filing fees for filings other than coastal development permit applications shall be as follows:
  - (1) (A) \$764\\$785 for either an extension or reconsideration of coastal development permit for a single-family dwellings.
    - (B) \$1,528\$1,569 for an extension or reconsideration of any other coastal development permit.
  - (2) \$764\\$785 for a "de minimis" waiver of a coastal development permit application pursuant to Public Resources Code section 30624.7 and for a waiver pursuant to sections 13250(c) and 13253(c) of this title.
  - (3) \$382<u>\$392</u> for any written confirmation of exemption from permit requirements of Public Resources Code section 30600.
  - (4) \$1,528\\$1,569 for any continuance requested by the applicant, except the first continuance.
  - (5) The filing fee for:
    - (A) any certification of consistency that is submitted to the Commission pursuant to sections 307(c)(3)(A) or (B) of the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 (16 USC section 1456(c)(3)(A), (B)), or
    - (B) any appeal to the Commission pursuant to Public Resources Code sections

30602 or 30603(a)(5) by an applicant of a denial of a coastal development permit application shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of subsection (a).

- (6) The request for a boundary determination pursuant to either section 13255.1 or 13576(c) shall be accompanied by a filing and processing fee of \$382\$392. For a request for a boundary determination pursuant to section 13255.1 or 13576(c)(2) that pertains to two or more parcels, the fee shall be paid on a per parcel basis.
- (7) The request for a boundary adjustment pursuant to section 13255.2 shall be accompanied by a filing and processing fee of \$7,640\$7,845.
- (e) Where a development consists of a land division including, but not limited to, lot line adjustments or issuance of a conditional certificate of compliance pursuant to Government Code section 66499.35(b), the fee shall be \$4,584\frac{\$4,707}{} for each of the first four lots, plus \$1,528\frac{\$1,569}{} for each additional lot. Conversion to condominiums shall be considered a division of the land.
- (f) If different types of developments are included in one permit application, the fee shall be the sum of the fees that would apply if each development was proposed in a separate application. However, in no case shall the fee for residential development exceed \$152,800\\$156,900 and in no case shall the fee for all other development exceed \$382,000\\$392,250.
