CALIFORNIA COASTAL COMMISSION CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

The Political Reform Act (Gov. Code, § 81000, et seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (Cal. Code of Regs., tit. 2, § 18730) whichthat contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code, which can be incorporated by reference in an agency's code. After public notice and hearing, it the standard code may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference. This regulation and the attached Appendix Appendices, designating efficials and employeespositions and establishing disclosure categories, shall constitute the conflict of interest code of the California Coastal Commission (Commission).

Commission Members, Alternates, and the Executive Director must file their statements of economic interests electronically with the Fair Political Practices

Commission. All other individuals holding designated positions must file their statements with the California Coastal Commission. All statements must be made available for public inspection and reproduction under Government Code Section 81008.

Individuals holding designated positions shall file their statements of economic interests with the Commission, which will make the statements available for public inspection and reproduction (Gev. Code Sec. 81008). Upon receipt of the statements from Commission Member Alternates and the Executive Director, the Commission shall make and retain copies and forward the originals to the Fair Political Practices Commission. All other statements will be retained by the Commission.

Such determination shall include a description of the consultant's or new position's duties and, based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. The Executive Director's determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this conflict-of-interest code. (Gov. Code, § 81008.)

The following individuals are required to file under Government Code section 87200 and are NOT covered by this Code. They are listed for informational purposes only.

*Persons in this category report pursuant to Article 2, Chapter 7 of the Political Reform Act of 1974. These positions appear in this conflict of interest code on an informational basis only; additional disclosure is not required by the Coastal Commission Members.

APPENDIX B

DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES

- 1. <u>Designated positions assigned to this category report all investments and business positions in business entities, sources of income (including receipt of gifts, loans and travel payments) and interests in real property if the business entity, source, or real property is subject to the Commission's regulatory or permitting authority.</u>
- 2. <u>Designated positions assigned to this category report all investments and business positions in business enties, sources of income (including receipt of gifts, loans and travel payments) and interests in real property that are the subject of a proceeding before the Commission.</u>
- 3. <u>Designated positions assigned to this category report investments and business positions in business entities and sources of income (including receipt of gifts, loans and travel payments) if the business entity or source provides leased facilities, products, equipment, vehicles, machinery or services (including training or consulting services) of the type utilized by the Commission.</u>
- (a) Persons in this category shall report all sources of income, including gifts, interests in real property, and investments and business positions in business entities.
- (b) Persons in this category shall report all investments or business positions, in any business entity, all interests in real property, and all sources of income, including gifts, which the person knows or has reason to know is the subject of a proceeding before the California Coastal Commission, and subject to the following limitations:
 - 1) Income, not including a gift, is reportable only if it is received from a source in or doing business within California, planning on doing business within California, or has done business within California during the two years prior to the time any statement is required under this code.
 - 2) A gift is reportable regardless of the location of the source.
 - 3) An interest in real property is reportable only if property or any part of it is located within the State of California.
 - 4) Investments are reportable only if the business entity has an interest in real property in the State of California, or does business, or plans to do business in the State of California at any time during the two years prior to the time any statement is required under this code.
 - 5) Business entities are reportable for purposes of business position

disclosure, only if the business is doing business, or plans to do business in the State of California at any time during the two years prior to the time any statement is required under this code.

- (c) Persons in this category shall disclose any investment or business position in a business entity or income, including gifts, from a source which is of the type that contracts with the Coastal Commission to provide goods, services, materials or facilities to the Coastal Commission.
- (d) Persons in this category are considered designated employees. They are bound by the disclosure and disqualification requirements of this code. The Executive Director, however, may determine in writing that a particular consultant, although a "designated position," is hired to perform a range of duties that is limited in scope and thus is not required to fully comply with the disclosure requirements in this section. Such written determination shall include a description of the consultant's duties and, based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. The Executive Director's determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this conflict of interest code. Nothing herein excuses any such consultant from any other provision of this code.
