History California NPS Program

- First NPS Management Plan adopted in 1988
- Significant upgrade approved in 2000
 - Created a 15-year strategy 1998 2013
 - Committed to developing 500 to 800 individual TMDLs for 1,500 waterbody-pollutant combinations on 303d list
 - Satisfied CWA 319 requirements for "upgraded program" and CZARA requirements for CNPCP
 - Adopted 61 MMs
 - Contained a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the State Water Board and CA Coastal Commission to implement NPS Program

The Who and What of the CA NPS Program

WHO

- About 20 staff funded by CWA 319 grant distributed across the state
 - About 5 staff at State Water Board (Sacramento, CA)
 - About 1 3 staff per each of the nine Regional Water Boards
- California Coastal Commission

WHAT

Restore and protect waters impacted by nonpoint sources of pollution

The How of the CA NPS Program

HOW

- Administer competitive sub-grant program with funds from CWA 319
- Award approx. \$4 million to subrecipients per year
- Inter and Intra-Agency coordination (e.g., Board of Forestry, NRCS, and Irrigated Lands Regulatory Program)

CANPS Grant Program Eligibility

Applicant must be a public agency, nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization, Federally Recognized Tribe, state agency, public college, or a federal agency.

Implement watershed-based plan and/or a Total Maximum Daily Load, demonstrate water quality improvement

Address a NPS Program Preference

Minimum \$250k, maximum \$800k, 25% matching funds unless eligible for match waiver. Project must be completed in three years or less




Amount of Post-Fire Recovery Funding per Year, 2016 – 2021


