

Why do we exist?

- Who got involved?

- How was the program developed?
 - By understanding the issues and collaborating with other programs from other states



The Clean Marinas Alliance

Established in 2004, the Clean Marinas Program is a partnership of private marina owners, government marina operators and yacht clubs.



Mission Statement

The Clean Marinas Program is an ongoing endeavor, by a marina industry alliance, determined to provide environmentally clean facilities and protect the states' coastal and inland waters from pollution through compliance of best management practices.



Review Process and Benefits

- **Marina Review:**
3–4 hours covering 13 environmental sections and a site inspection.
- **Cost:**
 - \$750 –New Certification 5–yr.
 - \$500 –Re–Certification 5–yr.
- **Designation Includes:**
 - Certificate
 - Website listing
 - Flag, Burgee, Window Decals
 - Use of Program logo for marketing as “Clean Marinas Certified” in brochures websites and advertisements.

Scoring

The program consists of ‘Mandatory Points’ and ‘Additional Points’. In order to become certified a Marina or Yacht Club must have:

Mandatory Points = 100%

Additional Points = 75%

- **Scoresheet and Outside Checklist**– available to print from website.
- **Reference Scoresheet** – indicates what is looked for in each section – available on website.
- **Sample Templates** – available on request for help in preparation.
- **Mentor** – 28 Mentors and Reviewers Statewide –List available.
- **Attend a Certification** – all Certifications are open for observation.
