What is the Clean Marine Program?

Established in **2004**, the Clean Marinas Program began a partnership of private marina operators, government marina operators, yacht clubs and boatyard operators. It is an Industry led program.

The Program was developed to ensure clean facilities exist in our boating communities and protect the states' coastal and inland waters from pollution through **Best Management Practices**.



Who Got Involved

- Private marina owners, government marina operators and yacht clubs. Industry Associations: Marine Recreation Association and California Association of Harbor Masters & Port Captains
- Industry Representatives worked with the Coastal Commission and implemented 150 recommendations from the IACC (Inter-Agency Coordinating Committee)

2018 News and Announcements

- **Merge with Boatyards** – Worked with Paul Kaplan, KKMI over the last year to incorporate the boat yards in the program with separate boatyard specific scoresheets.
- **Scoresheet Update** January 2018 includes:
 - Elimination of approximately 90% of the non- applicable column
 - Trash Skimmers added to Additional Points – Solid Waste
 - Host Clean-Up Events added to Additional Points - Environmental Programs
- **Hired Administrative Position** May 2018
 - Assist with the demand & interest in the program



Clean Marine Administration

- Completely Voluntary – **11 Member Board of Directors**
- Financed entirely by the marina industry thru the Certification Fee
- Train and coordinate review teams
- Updates the program manual content
- Maintain a Website and communicate with stakeholders, government entities and the public



Cost and Benefits

- Certification Marina \$750.00 Initial Fee / Certification BoatYard \$1200 Initial Fee
- Re-Certification Marina \$500.00/BoatYard \$800.00 Every Five Years
- Certificate and website listing
- Flag, burgee and decals for display at facility
- Eligible for marketing (use of Logo) as a certified Clean Marine facility
- Education of Boaters/Public on Clean boating practices



Program Manuals

- The Clean Marine Program Manuals and their associated Score Sheets provide a comprehensive guide along with the tools necessary to foster and monitor the certification of a Clean Waterfront Facility
- They contain Best Management Practices for all activities and devices that help prevent or reduce water pollution.
