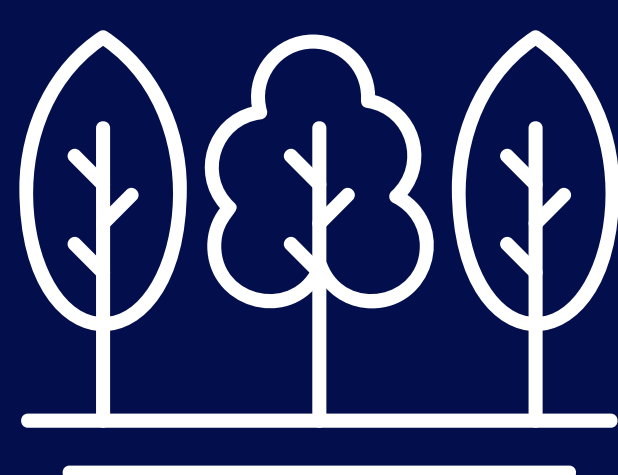

## Public Works Plans (PWP)

Wildfire resilience projects in the coastal zone are critically important to protect homes, communities, and diverse ecosystems from catastrophic damage. To achieve streamlined authorization under the Coastal Act for large-scale wildfire resilience projects over multiple years, the Commission has partnered with public agencies to prepare Public Works Plans (PWPs) that are tailored to the specific needs of their communities and their habitat types.

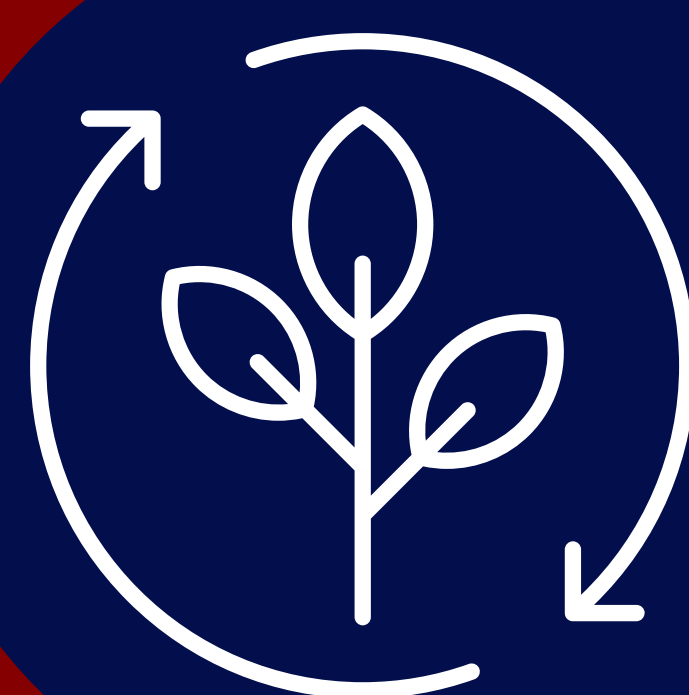
### Wildfire Resilience Project Types
