STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Commission open and continue the public hearing to determine whether a substantial issue exists with respect to the grounds on which the appeal has been filed for the following reason:

report that adequately analyses the issues for the Commission.

Pursuant to Section 30621 of the Coastal Act, an appeal must be heard within 49 days from the date an appeal of a Coastal Development Permit issued pursuant to a certified Local Coastal Program is received. An appeal of the above described decision was received in the Commission office and filed effective on December 5, 1995; the 49th day falls after the Commission's January, 1996, meeting. However, due to the reason described above, staff recommends that the Commission open and continue the public hearing. The appeal will then be tentatively scheduled for a full substantial issue hearing at the Commission's meeting of February 6-9, 1996, in San Diego.
