RE: SANTA BARBARA COUNTY LCP AMENDMENT 3-95 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S DETERMINATION THAT THE COUNTY"S ACKNOWLEDGEMENT IS LEGALLY ADEQUATE. (For Commission review at its meeting of September 10 - 13, 1996.)

On June 14, 1996 the Commission approved LCP Amendment 3-95 with, suggested modifications, submitted by the County of Santa Barbara. This amendment would:

Amend the the current Land Use Designation for a 17.4 acre portion of a parcel known as APN 79-210-059 (Site I) from Recreational to Single Family Residential 1.0 maximum dwelling units per 3 acres; (2) Amend the existing Affordable Housing Overlay of RES 12.3 - 175 units on a 14.2 acre parcel known as APN 79-210-049 (Site II) to place an Affordable Housing Overlay of RES 8.0 - 175 units on combined Sites I and II, totalling 31.6 acres; (3) Rezone the current Zoning Designation of 17.4 acre portion of a parcel known as APN 79-210-059 (Site I) from Recreation to DR-0.1, Design Residential 0.1 maximum dwelling units per gross acre; and (4) Rezone the existing Affordable Housing Zoning Overlay of DR 12.3 - 175 Max units on a 14.2 acre parcel know as APN 79-210-049 (Site II) to place an Affordable Housing Overaly of DR-6 -- 175 Max units on combined Sites I and II, totalling 31.6 acres.

On July 9, 1996 the County of Santa Barbara acknowledged receipt of the Commission resolution for LCP Amendment 3-95 and transmitted the acknowledgement to the Commission on July 19, 1996. In its acknowledgement the County accepted the Commission's action including the suggested modifications, and agreed to issue coastal Development Permits in conformance with the Commission's resolution.

As provided for in section 13544.5 of the Commission's Administrative Regulations, the Executive Director must determine if the action of the County of Santa Barbara is legally sufficient and report that determination to the Commission. The certification shall become effective unless a majority of the Commission objects to the determination.

I have reviewed the County's acknowledgement adopted July 9, 1996 regarding LCP amendment 3-95 and find that it fulfills the conditions of certification of the County's Local Coastal Program, and that the County's action and notification procedures for appealable development legally satisfies the Commission's certification resolution adopted June 14, 1996. I therefore recommend that the Commission concur in this determination.
