DETERMINATION THAT THE CITY'S ACKNOWLEDGMENT IS LEGALLY ADEQUATE.

(For Commission review at its meeting of January 12 - 16, 1998.)

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Commission CONCUR with the Executive Director's determination that the City's action is legally adequate.

BACKGROUND

On May 13, 1997 the Commission approved LCP Amendment 2-97 as submitted by the City of Carpinteria. This amendment would amend the Coastal Plan Land Use Plan in three areas, each considered a separate component of this amendment:

Component 1 Ag Packing Houses to Palm Avenue Change for Land Use Designation and Zoning Map

for ten parcels from General Industry to Multi-Residential and Planned Residential

Development, respectively; and Change Land Use Designation and Zoning Map for four parcels from General Industry to General Commercial/Resort Visitor Serving Commercial and

Commercial Planned Development, respectively.

Component 2 Brown-Serena-et. al. Property Change Land Use Plan Map designation for one parcel from

"undesignated" to Planned Unit Development.

Component 3 Faith Lutheran Church Change Land Use designation and Zoning Map from

Institutional/Government and Community Facility to Single Family Residential for one portion

of a 2.7 acre parcel to eliminate the existing "split-zoning".

On October 27, 1997, the City of Carpinteria acknowledged receipt of the Commission resolution for LCP Amendment 2-97 and transmitted the acknowledgment to the Commission on November 10, 1997. In its acknowledgment the City of Carpinteria accepted the Commission's action and agreed to issue coastal development permits in conformance with the Commission's resolution.

As provided for in Section 13544.5 of the Commission's Administrative Regulations, the Executive Director must determine if the action of the City Council is legally sufficient and report that determination to the Commission. The certification shall become effective unless a majority of the Commission objects to the determination.

I have reviewed the City's acknowledgment adopted October 27, 1997 regarding LCP Amendment 2-97 and finds it fulfills the conditions of certification of the City of Carpinteria Local Coastal Program, and that the City's action and notification procedures for appealable development legally satisfies the Commission's certification resolution adopted May 13, 1997. I therefore recommend that the Commission concur in this determination. crp297ed.doc
