Gary A. Brooks and Simon Poulta, representing the applicant spoke. Larry Barels, George Cox, and Gary Ross, all representing Coastal Preservation Research Foundation, spoke in favor and about their concerns of the project. Mark Massara, representing the Sierra Club, spoke in opposition to the project.

Motion & Vote: Allen moved staff recommendation, seconded by Potter, and the roll call vote was 11 in favor and 0 opposed. Passed.


