**Re:** University of California Santa Barbara (UCSB) Long Range Development Plan (LRDP) Amendment 1-98 Time Extension for Commission Final Action. Extension Request to be Heard at the September 10, 1998 Commission Meeting in Eureka.

On June 30, 1998, UCSB submitted an LRDP amendment. On July 10, 1998, the Executive Director determined that the University's amendment was in proper order and legally adequate to comply with the submittal requirements of Coastal Act Section 30510(b).

Pursuant to Sections 30512(a), 30514(b), and 30605 of the Coastal Act and Sections 13522, 13535(b), and 13537(a) of the Commission's regulations, an LRDP amendment must be scheduled for a public hearing and the Commission must take final action to certify or refuse to certify the amendment, in whole or in part, within ninety (90) days after a complete submittal. The 90th day after filing of the complete submittal of UCSB LRDP Amendment 1-98 is October 10, 1998. In order to be heard within this time frame, the amendment would have to be scheduled for the September 8-11, 1998 Commission Meeting.

Coastal Act Section 30517 and California Code of Regulations Section 13535(c) state that the Commission may extend the 90 day time limit, for good cause, for a period not to exceed one year. On July 20, 1998, the University requested this extension in order to further evaluate consistency between the proposed Lagoon Management Plan and the future San Rafael Student Housing Addition Project which will be potentially located adjacent to the Lagoon Management Area. UCSB has submitted a letter dated July 20, 1998, waiving the 90 day time limit for a period not to exceed one year (Exhibit 1).

Commission Staff is recommending this extension to accommodate the University's request and to facilitate the opportunity for public participation at the hearing. Therefore, staff recommends that the Commission extend the 90 day time limit to act upon UCSB LRDP Amendment 1-98 for a period not to exceed one year.

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION AND MOTION**

Staff recommends that the Commission vote to extend the deadline for Commission action for up to one year.

**Motion:** *I move that the Commission extend the 90 day time limit to act on the University of California Santa Barbara Long Range Development Plan Amendment No. 1-98 for a period not to exceed one year.*

**Recommendation:** *Staff recommends a YES vote. An affirmative vote of a majority of the Commissioners present is needed to pass this motion.*
