SUBJECT: Request to Waive Time Limits for the City of Del Mar Local Coastal
Program (LCP) 1-99, Commission Meeting of August 10-13, 1999

On 5/27/99, the City of Del Mar LCP implementation plan, LCP 1-99, was received in the San Diego office. The submittal was deemed incomplete and a letter dated 6/11/99 was sent to the City to this effect. Upon submittal of additional information, the file was deemed completed and filed on 6/25/99. The LCP submittal consists of the implementation plan for the City's LCP.

Pursuant to Section 30513 of the Coastal Act, implementation plans must be acted upon by the Commission within 60 days of their filing. Based on the above-cited time limits, the proposed LCP submittal, which consists of the implementing ordinances for the City's LCP, must be scheduled for review by the Commission at the August 10-13, 1999 meeting. However, Section 30517 of the Coastal Act and Section 13535(c) of the California Code of Regulations state that the Commission may extend for good cause the applicable time limits for a period not to exceed one year.

In this particular case, the City of Del Mar has formally requested that the item be postponed from the August Commission meeting to the October, 1999 meeting. The meeting will be held in San Diego, which will be a more convenient venue both for the City representatives and for any members of the public who may wish to attend. Staff supports the City's request.

Staff Recommendation: Staff recommends that the Commission extend the 60-day time limit for a period not to exceed one year. However, the LCP Implementation Plan is being scheduled for the October, 1999 hearing in San Diego.

MOTION:

I move that the Commission extend the 60-day time limit to act on the City of Del Mar Local Coastal Program Implementation Plan 1-99 for a period not to exceed one year.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends a YES vote. An affirmative vote by a majority of the Commissioners present is needed to pass the motion.
