Subject: Summary of Coastal Conservancy Actions, February 2000 Meeting

Significant Events at the February 24 Meeting of the Coastal Conservancy

- 1. The Conservancy authorized the following grants for coastal projects:
 - a. \$300,000 to the City of Long Beach for preparation of feasibility studies for two potential wetland restoration sites along the lower Los Angeles River.
 - b. \$400,000 to the City of Paramount to acquire the Fitzpatrick property for public access along the Los Angeles River to the coast.
 - c. \$55,000 to the Friends of the Los Angeles River to assist with implementation of a River Watch program for the Los Angeles River.
 - d. \$17,000,000 for the acquisition of Southern California Edison Company properties at **Ormond Beach**, **Mandalay Dunes**, and **Huntington Beach**, including a grant to the Huntington Beach Wetlands Conservancy for the acquisition of the Huntington Beach property, and for consulting services to prepare restoration plans and other analyses of the properties.
 - e. \$69,000 to the Malibu Foundation for Environmental Education for pre-project feasibility analyses of the proposed acceptance, construction, and management of public access on property which is the subject of an Offer-to-Dedicate Fee Title on Malibu Road in Malibu, Los Angeles County.
 - f. \$15,000 to The Conservation Fund for preparation of a feasibility study to evaluate potential land acquisitions on the Ferndale Coast in Humboldt County.
 - g. \$12,000 to the City of San Diego to implement a feasibility study for the Famosa Slough culvert extension project. The Conservancy also adopted the Famosa Slough Enhancement Plan.
- 2. The Conservancy authorized a \$30,000 grant to Land Partners Through Stewardship for the construction of a segment of the Bay Area Ridge Trail atop Sonoma Mountain in Sonoma County.
