Project description............Construction of a 10,000 square foot single family residence and 2,500

square foot barn on a coastal blufftop lot with approximately 1.25 mile access road (including slopes in excess of 30%), resulting in a total

disturbance area of approximately 179,000 square feet.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Commission **open** and **continue** the public hearing to determine whether a substantial issue exists with respect to the grounds on which the appeal has been filed for the following reason:

In accordance with section 13112 of the Commission's Administrative Regulations, staff has requested that the local government forward all relevant documents and materials regarding the subject permit within five working days of receipt of that notice. Relevant materials necessary for a complete analysis



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were received from the County on April 18, 2000, prior to the final day for completion of staff reports. However, this did not allow sufficient time for staff to analyze the issues and prepare a staff report with a recommendation for Commission action on this appeal.

Pursuant to section 30621 of the Coastal Act, an appeal must be heard within 49 days from the date an appeal of a coastal development permit issued pursuant to a certified Local Coastal Program was filed. The appeal of this County permit was filed on 4/7/00; the 49th day therefore falls on 4/27/00, after the Commission's April meeting, but before the Commission's May meeting. Therefore, staff recommends that the Commission open and continue the public hearing. The appeal will be tentatively scheduled for a substantial issue hearing at the Commission's June meeting in Santa Barbara.
