Subject: Summary of Coastal Conservancy Actions, June 2000 Meeting

## Significant Events at the June 22 Meeting of the Coastal Conservancy

- 1. The Conservancy authorized the following grants for coastal projects:
  - a. \$500,000 to LandPaths to acquire the Van Alstyne Redwood Grove, located near the town of Occidental, Sonoma County.
  - b. \$4,200,000 to the City of San Diego to acquire the Torrey Surf Property on Carmel Mountain for habitat protection, open space, and public access.
  - c. \$613,499 to the Los Angeles and San Gabriel Rivers Watershed Council to fund projects along the Los Angeles River and its tributaries.
  - d. \$525,150 to the City of Long Beach to implement the first two phases of the Belmont Pier Restoration Project.
- 2. The Conservancy directed staff to meet with California State Parks and the North Coast Interpretive Association to prepare a plan for future management of the Point Cabrillo Preserve in Mendocino County.
- 3. The Conservancy did not act on adoption of a logo for the Coastal Trail, as contained in Recommendation 12 of the California Coastal Commission's *Public Access Action Plan* dated June 1999, and directed staff to return with a more acceptable logo design.
- 4. The Conservancy authorized the following grants for San Francisco Bay projects:
  - a. \$1,683,000 to the Napa County Flood Control and Water Conservation District for acquisition of one or more of six parcels within the Napa River Enhancement Plan area for purposes of wetland enhancement and flood reduction.
  - b. \$100,000 to the City and County of San Francisco Recreation and Parks Department to construct upland habitat and erosion control improvements along new segments of the San Francisco Bay Trail as part of the shoreline park development at **India Basin**.
  - c. \$45,000 to the Urban Creeks Council for the restoration of Baxter Creek in Richmond, Conta Costa County.

d. \$149,250 for the preparation of environmental review documentation for the Introduced Spartina Eradication Project.
