STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Commission open and continue the public hearing to determine whether Substantial Issue exists with respect to the grounds on which the appeal has been filed.

Section 30621 of the Coastal Act requires that an appeal must be heard within 49 days from the date that an appeal of a coastal development permit, which has been approved/denied pursuant to a certified Local Coastal Program, is received. However, in this case, the applicant/appellant (Union Pacific Railroad) has indicated that they wish to submit additional information and have requested additional time to prepare for a public hearing. applicant/appellant has submitted two consecutive letters respectively dated July 13 and 14, 2000, waiving their right to a hearing of the above referenced coastal development permit appeal within the required 49 day period required by Section 30621 of the Coastal Act (Exhibits 1 & 2).

Staff is recommending that the Commission open and continue this item in order to accommodate the applicant/appellant's request and to allow for adequate review of the administrative record for City of Carpinteria Coastal Development Permit Application File No. 99-883-CDP.

Dear Mr. Hudson:

This follows our recent phone conversation regarding the appeal submitted by Union Pacific Railroad ("UP") and the California Department of Transportation ("Caltrans") concerning the Carpinteria Siding Project in Carpinteria, Santa Barbara County. As we discussed, the Commission is required by statute to hold a hearing within 49 days of the Commission's filing the appeal, which you stated occurred on July 3. The Commission's next monthly hearing is in early August, and you stated that staff would need to begin preparing the staff report on the appeal now in order to have it ready for the August hearing.

The project proponents have requested additional time to submit a number of additional documents, including a study of the potential impacts of the project on harbor seals, an arborist's report on the eucalyptus windrow, a geologist's report on bluff retreat, and a revegetation plan for the site. They have also requested that the appeal and the permit for the project be consolidated and have yet to file the permit application documentation. You have also requested additional information regarding potential alternative sites for the project.

Since it will not be possible to submit all this documentation in time for the appeal and the application to be heard at the August hearing, the project proponents have agreed to waive the 49-day hearing deadline, pursuant to Public Resources Code § 30625(a).
