#### **SUMMARY OF STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

The staff recommends the Commission OPEN AND CONTINUE the public hearing to determine whether a substantial issue exists with respect to the grounds on which the appeal has been filed for the following reasons:

Pursuant to Section 30621 of the Coastal Act, an appeal must be heard within 49 days from the date an appeal of the locally-issued coastal development permit is received. The appeal on the above-described decision was received in the Commission office on December 18. 2000. In accordance with the California Code of Regulations, staff requested all relevant documents and materials regarding the subject permit from the City on December 19, 2000. As of the date of this writing, this information has not been received. The 49th day. February 5, 2001, from the initial filing would be after the January 9-12, 2001 meeting, but before the February 13-16, 2001 meeting. Pursuant to Section 13112 of the California Code of Regulations, if the Commission fails to receive the documents and materials, the Commission must open and continue the hearing until receipt of the local government's file.
