IV. LCP STATUS

Within the Commission's South Coast District, there are currently 22 local jurisdictions with 35 LCP segments. Seventeen of the segments (48.6%) are effectively certified. All are overdue for Periodic Review.

V. ONGOING LOCAL COASTAL PLANNING:

Several local governments are completing LCPs under planning grants awarded by the Commission:

- The City of Los Angeles is completing an LUP for Pacific Palisades segment of the LCP.
- The City of Hermosa Beach completed an LCP and it is pending review by the Commission.
- The City of Redondo Beach is completing an LCP as part of larger city- wide Specific Planning effort.

In addition, staff is aware of other locally initiated planning:

- The City of Los Angeles is beginning work on the development of its implementing ordinances.
- The City of Huntington Beach is in the process of updating their LCP.

III. OTHER RELATED PLANNING EFFORTS (e.g. General Plan updates, HCP/NCCP efforts, etc.)

Legislation (SB 516) now being considered would require the City of Newport Beach, on or before June 30, 2003, or 24 months after annexation of the Annexed Areas of Orange County, whichever comes first, submit an LCP for the entire jurisdiction to the Commission for certification.

In terms of HCP/NCCP efforts, there is a Palos Verde Peninsula Subregional Plan under development, which would address coastal sage scrub plant communities issues on the entire peninsula; it is expected to be completed this year. Additionally, the Orange County Southern Subregion plan is being drafted; it is a subregional preserve plan and special area management plan to address wetlands and endangered species protection.

VI. POST-CERTIFICATION ACTIONS

In the South Coast District, most post-certification appeals of local coastal permit decisions have been made from decisions of the cities of Rancho Palos Verdes, Long Beach, Laguna Beach and Huntington Beach. Of 92 appeals, Commission found Substantial Issue in 47 of the appeals

(51%). The issues raised most frequently have been Public Access and Scenic and Visual Resources / Landform Alteration.
