Coastal Commission Workshop on the Significance of Native Habitats in the Santa Monica Mountains

Thursday, June 13, 2002 from 9:00 A.M.– 12:00 P.M. Queen Mary, Long Beach

Purpose and Goals:

- 1. To identify and describe the significance of native habitats in the Santa Monica Mountains with special focus on coastal sage scrub and chaparral.
- 2. To describe wildlife use of those habitats.
- 3. To show the degree to which the different habitats are either interrelated or ecologically independent.
- 4. To assess qualitatively the effects on the ecosystem of loss or fragmenting significant portions of the coastal sage scrub and chaparral.

Focus of Testimony

The principal goal of the workshop is to provide the Commission with factual information regarding the importance of coastal sage scrub and chaparral to the natural functioning of the Santa Monica Mountains ecosystem.

The Commission *will not* be taking any testimony on the City of Malibu Local Coastal Program, the ESHA designations, the ESHA maps, or the consequence of ESHA designation. Commission staff is currently revising the draft ESHA findings and maps and will complete the revisions after this workshop. The Commission will hold a public hearing at the July 2002 Commission meeting in Huntington Beach on the revised Land Use Plan, the draft implementation plan, revised ESHA findings and revised ESHA maps for the City of Malibu Local Coastal Program. The public and agencies will have an opportunity in July to address the Commission on ESHA issues in the City of Malibu at the July public hearing.
