## Significant Events at the September 25 Meeting of the State Coastal Conservancy in San Pedro

#### South Coast

- 1. The Conservancy approved a \$10,000,000 disbursement for the acquisition by the Wildlife Conservation Board of 193 acres of the historic **Ballona Wetlands** complex in Los Angeles.
- 2. The Conservancy approved a \$10,000,000 disbursement to the Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy to acquire the approximately 2,900-acre property commonly known as the Ahmanson Ranch located in the Malibu Creek Watershed, Ventura County.
- 3. The Conservancy appointed Paul Morabito to the Governing Board of the Santa Monica Bay Restoration Commission, with the Executive Officer of the Conservancy, or his designee, to serve as Designated Representative.

## San Francisco Bay Area

4. The Conservancy certified the "Final Programmatic Environmental Impact Statement/Environmental Impact Report, San Francisco Estuary Invasive Spartina Project: Spartina Control Program," and authorized: 1) implementation of the Spartina Control Program; 2) acceptance of \$50,000 from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service as an augmentation of a 1999 CALFED grant to the Conservancy; 3) disbursement of up to \$700,000, consisting of the \$50,000 in augmented 1999 CALFED grant funds and \$650,000 of Conservancy funds, for the purchase of equipment and for environmental consulting services needed to operate and manage the Spartina Control Program; and 4) disbursement of up to \$180,600 in funds, available under the 1999 CALFED grant and an additional 2001 CALFED grant to the Conservancy, as separate grants to ten organizations for Spartina treatment and removal demonstration projects.

The next Coastal Conservancy meeting is scheduled to take place on October 23, 2003.
