City of Santa Barbara Local Coastal Program Amendment No. SB-MAJ-1-04

[Hotel and Related Commerce (HRC) Zones and Ocean-Oriented Commercial (OC) Zone] Time Extension for Commission Meeting of

October 15, 2004.

On July 27, 2004, the City of Santa Barbara submitted an amendment to its certified Local Coastal Program (LCP). The amendment includes a proposal to (1) create an Ocean Oriented Commercial (OC) land use designation and re-designate portions of the interior Waterfront area from the existing HRC-2 (Hotel & Related Commerce) land use designation to an OC and a dual HRC/OC land use designation, and (2) amend the Zoning Ordinance to include the new OC and dual HRC/OC zone to the applicable areas. On August 31, 2004, the Executive director determined that the City's amendment submittal was in proper order and legally adequate to comply with the submittal requirements of Coastal Act Section 30510 (b).

Pursuant to Section 30514 of the Coastal Act, an amendment to a certified LCP must be scheduled for a public hearing and the Commission must take action within 90 days of a complete submittal. The 90<sup>th</sup> day after filing the complete submittal is November 29, 2004. In order to be heard within this time frame, the amendment would have to be scheduled for the Commission's November 17-19, 2004 meeting.

Coastal Act Section 30517 and California Code of Regulations Section 13535 (c) state that the Commission may extend for good cause the 90-day time limit for a period not to exceed one year. Commission staff is requesting an extension to the 90-day time limit in order to consult further with the City and to allow for more thorough review of the amendment. Therefore, staff recommends that the Commission extend the 90-day time limit to act on City of Santa Barbara LCP Amendment No. SB-MAJ-1-04 for a period not to exceed one year.

## STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Commission vote to extend the deadline for Commission action for up to one year.

MOTION:

I move that the Commission extend the 90-day time limit to act on the City of Santa Barbara Local Coastal Program Amendment No. SB-MAJ-1-04 for a period not to

exceed one year.

**RECOMMENDATION:** Staff recommends a **YES** vote. An affirmative vote of a majority of the Commission present is needed to pass the motion.
