SUBJECT: County of Santa Barbara LCP Amendment MAJ-1-04 (Toro Canyon Plan): Executive Director's determination that the County's acknowledgement of receipt, acceptance, and agreement with the Commission's certification with suggested modifications is legally adequate. This determination will be reported to the Commission at the December 9, 2004 meeting in San Rafael.

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On October 15, 2004 the Commission approved Local Coastal Program Amendment No. MAJ-1-04 submitted by the County of Santa Barbara with suggested modifications. This amendment designates the Toro Canyon Planning Area; adds goals, policies, actions, and development standards; and adopts implementing zoning district and overlay maps.

On November 9, 2004 the County Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 04-312 (attached) acknowledging receipt of the Commission's certification of LCP Amendment No. MAJ-1-04 and accepting and agreeing to all modifications suggested by the Commission.

Pursuant to Section 13544 of the California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Division 5.5, the Executive Director must determine that the action taken by the County of Santa Barbara acknowledging receipt and acceptance of, and agreement with the Commission's certification of the above referenced LCP amendment with suggested modifications is legally adequate and report that determination to the Commission. The certification shall become effective unless a majority of the Commissioners present object to the Executive Director's determination.

I have reviewed the County's acknowledgement and acceptance of, and agreement with the terms and suggested modifications of LCP Amendment MAJ-1-04, as certified by the Commission on October 15, 2004, as contained in the adopted Resolution of November 9, 2004 and find that the County's action and notification procedures for appealable development are legally adequate to satisfy the terms and requirements of the Commission's certification. I therefore recommend that the Commission concur in this determination.
