CITY OF OXNARD LCP AMENDMENT NO. OXN-MAJ-2-04 (Wireless Communications Ordinance): Executive Director's determination that the City's acknowledgement is legally adequate for Commission review at the California Coastal Commission hearing on December 8-10, 2004 in San

Francisco.

On October 15, 2004, the Commission approved LCP Amendment No. 2-04 submitted by the City of Oxnard with suggested modifications. This amendment adds an ordinance allowing for and providing development standards for wireless communication facilities into the City's certified Local Coastal Program.

On November 16, 2004, the City of Oxnard adopted Ordinance No. 2673 that acknowledged receipt of the Commission's resolution, and accepting and agreeing to all modifications suggested by the Commission. The adopted ordinance includes the exact language of the Commission's suggested modifications. The City transmitted Ordinance 2673 to the Commission on November 19, 2004.

Pursuant to Sections 13551(b) and 13544 of the California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Division 5.5, the Executive Director must determine if the action taken by the City of Oxnard acknowledging receipt and acceptance of, and agreement with the Commission's certification of LCPA 2-04 with suggested modifications is legally adequate and report that determination to the Commission. The certification shall be come effective unless a majority of the Commissioners object to the determination.

I have reviewed the City's acknowledgement in Ordinance 2673, adopted November 16, 2004 regarding LCP Amendment No. 2-04 and find that it fulfills the conditions of the Commission's action to certify Amendment No. 2-04, and that the City's action and notification procedures for appealable development legally satisfy the Commission's certification resolution adopted October 15, 2004. I therefore recommend that the Commission concur in this determination.
