1. CALL TO ORDER. The meeting of the California Coastal Commission was called to order on Wednesday, April 14, 2004, at 9:00 a.m. by Chairman Reilly.

2. **ROLL CALL**. Present: Chairman Reilly, Vice Chairman Burke, Commissioners Iseman, Kruer, Nava, Nichols, (Alternate) Allgood, Potter, Wan and Woolley. Absent: Chrisman, McGlain-Hill and Sandoval. Aronberg arrived at 9:30 a.m.

SOUTH COAST DISTRICT

3. **ADMINISTRATIVE PERMIT APPLICATIONS.** See items a through c on page 3 of the Meeting Notice. Staff recommended approval with special conditions.

Approved: There being no objection, Chairman Reilly ruled that these administrative permits be issued by the Executive Director.

John Tommy Rosas, Vice Chair Gabrielino/Tongva Tribal Council, Indians of California, raised issues of Catellus & Playa Vista violations, and said that polluted water discharge had damaged a registered sacred site. Leslie Purcell presented information about Catellus pumping dirty water and oily residue under Lincoln Blvd. onto the state-owned wetlands, in violation of their permit. Mark Massara, representing Sierra Club, reported that Santa Cruz County began constructing a seawall in disregard of the Commission's unanimous denial. Roger S. Miller complained that staff had not worked with him on the issue of a gate blocking his private easement. Linda Krop, representing EDC, thanked the Commission for traveling to various communities around the state, for staff participation on the Channel Islands National Marine Sanctuary Advisory Council, for responding to threats from Federal offshore oil & gas leases, and hoped that the Commission would protect coastal waters in the future consideration of LNG proposals and a fish farm proposal off Platform Grace. Jeff Kuyper, representing Environ. Defense Ctr., said he was sad that the Commission would not continue to pursue the periodic review of the San Luis Obispo Co. LCP, and that the County did not intend to comply with the recommendations. Tye Simpson, representing U.C. Santa Barbara, said the Ellwood-Devereau coast plan was an example of 3 jurisdictions working together. Betty Winholtz said that State Parks had cut trees within 500' of a raptor nest, in violation of its permit at Morro Bay State Park. Dianne Meester, representing County of Santa Barbara, spoke in support of the cooperation between the County, the University & the City of Goleta. Cynthia Hawley, representing Concerned Citizens of Los Osos, said the sewage treatment plant needed a separate coastal permit as a public works project. James Tkach said he hoped the Commission would continue to protect environmentally sensitive habitat and coastal views. Linde Owen, Concerned Citizens of Los Osos, complained about the lack of public participation in the process. Gewynn Taylor said the public was not being fairly represented. Betty Field-Haley displayed a book about a corporate yellow dragon. Lisa Schicker, representing Los Osos Tech Task Force, introduced herself and said "hello." Chris Allebe, representing

CCLO, encouraged the Commission to have occasional meetings in Santa Maria or San Luis Obispo.

LUNCH RECESS. The Commission recessed for lunch at 12:40 a.m. and returned at 2:15 p.m. after closed session. Kruer did not return after the break
