Subject: Request to extend the time limit for processing San Luis Obispo County Local Coastal Program Major Amendment Number 1-07 (Agricultural Land Division Ordinances).

Central Coast District staff has received the above-referenced Local Coastal Program (LCP) Amendment request from San Luis Obispo County to amend the LCP's Implementation Plan (IP).

Coastal Act Section 30510 provides that a proposed LCP (or LCP amendment) submittal must contain materials sufficient for a thorough and complete review. Once that requirement is satisfied, the Coastal Act requires that the Commission act on an Implementation Plan (IP) amendment within 60 days, and a Land Use Plan (LUP) amendment within 90 days (Sections 30512, 30513, and 30514(b)). Where an amendment request contains both IP and LUP amendments, Section 30511(a) of the Coastal Act allows for a 90 day period within which the Commission must act.

Central Coast District staff received the LCP amendment package from the County on May 8, 2007. The amendment request was subsequently filed on June 21, 2007. The 60th day falls on August 20, 2007. Coastal Act Section 30517 allows the Commission to extend, for good cause, the applicable time limit for a period not to exceed one year. In this case, the proposed amendment presents significant Coastal Act issues, for which Commission staff has not yet had sufficient time with which to analyze, and a later meeting date would allow for adequate review and consultation with the County regarding any possible amendment modifications. A one-year extension would result in a new deadline for Commission action on the proposed amendment of August 20, 2008. Although staff believes that this matter will be resolved before the new deadline, it has generally been the Commission's practice to extend such deadlines for a full year as provided by the Coastal Act to allow for flexibility in hearing scheduling (including to accommodate any requested or otherwise necessary postponements, continuances, etc.) and in terms of allotting scarce staff resources. Therefore, staff requests an extension of time not to exceed one year.

Summary of the Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Commission extend the 60 day time limit (as applicable) for a period not to exceed one year.

Motion. I move that the Commission extend the 60 day time limit to act on San Luis Obispo County Local Coastal Program Amendment Number 1-07 to August 20, 2008.

Staff Recommendation. Staff recommends a **YES** vote. An affirmative vote of a majority of the Commissioners present is needed to pass the motion.
