


#### Good morning gentlemen,



The Clean Water Now! Coalition supports ALL of the City of Laguna Beach recommendations regarding items **F9a-e**.

We disagree with your staff in regards to their opposition to **Picnic Beach** and **Bird Rock** structures, Appeal Numbers **A-5-LGB-08-050** and **A-5-LGB-08-051** respectively.

CWN!C is the local facilitator for the CCC beach cleanup programs. We are the sole designated administrators of not only the *Adopt-A-Beach* program but *California Coastal Cleanup* Day as well for the past 9 years, responsible for all 7 miles of coastline. Having continual, first hand knowledge and continuous connectivity this makes us well aware of the ephemeral or episodic conditions that affect projects like this. I am also a former Long Beach Lifeguard, a 37-year resident of Laguna Beach and have been a builder here for the same period. I am also a professional hydrology and water quality consultant, therefore in a unique position to comment with expertise.

We base our sustaining of the CLB permitting approvals for several reasons described below, including two (2) known concepts integral in environmental review not mentioned in your staff report: *Economic Feasibility (EF)* and *Technological Possibility (TP)*.

We believe that the potential for ecological damage caused by temporary structures far outweighs staff objections. Whether by mischief, by wave run-up or a combination thereof, the permanent placement is the most feasible resulting in negligible adverse impacts, beach access/use, view loss, and it provides the CLB Marine Safety Department the ability to provide proactive services. It is the best alternative.

Moreover, after viewing the conceptual drawings submitted by the appellant, subsequent research reveals that no such structures presently exist. Therefore, these drawings are fantasies, and moreover who will pay engineers to design and build the prototypes, basically experimental structures? It is also arguable that even if built, being anomalies they would require special maintenance. As an experienced builder of both commercial and residential projects, the hydraulic lifting system wouldn't lend itself well to the shifting sand as anyone standing in the saturated sandy "jello" of near tidal



zones knows that these fantasy devices would have to be advanced-science gyroscopic, able to shift autonomously of the constant re-calibration required to stabilize them. Guards cannot remain 24/7 to assure success. And if the CLB goes through the expense and satisfies the applicant, these prototypes subsequently fail, then what? We believe that means that they don't fulfill the *EF/TP* criteria.

We are personally aware of the historical difficulties regarding our existing "skid" type temporary stations and their inherent failures, thus they are neither a viable or best alternative.

View loss is negligible, offset by the increased flexibility and efficiency regarding Marine Safety Protection. The views from the bluff aren't affected at all. Laguna Beach is now considered a year round destination resort city, and the flexibility offered by permanent stands obviates need for the obvious logistical difficulties of dragging or transporting stands during the episodic hot weather periods that occur October through April. The reality is we no longer have an "off season."

Being self-indemnified, the loss of one life due to inadequate facilities/service could result in litigation claiming a form of negligence exposure on the CLB's part.

As the CLB assumes all fiscal risk, offers to preclude any future blufftop or shoreline protection devices, we feel that all five (5) installations should be approved over staff objections. We also feel that the potential for ecological damage by moving around or completely removing temporary structures off-site represents more of an adverse impact than permanent structures. The invasive vehicles and/or machines necessary for these tactics cut wide swaths/paths out of the beach itself.



Having grown up in Laguna Beach, I am familiar with both the current lifeguard towers as well as the previous chairs. I am also married to a former Laguna Beach lifeguard, and the sister of a current Lieutenant guard.

When the city chose to install the new towers I was relieved. For many years the young lifeguards of Laguna were forced to sit in the baking summer sun, day after day. No sun umbrella or sunscreen can offer sufficient protection from the sun's heat and rays, especially when a guard is exposed for more than seven hours per day.

Other cities have also chosen to install more protective towers for their guards; Laguna's towers are miniature in comparison with those of Los Angeles county, where I now reside. The funky old red chairs of the city's past are a fond memory of Laguna residents, and it took many people a while to adjust to the new aesthetic of the towers. Ms. Signi said she was told by Coastal Commission staff that whenever there is a choice between permanent or temporary structures on the beach, they would always choose temporary. But, here the Commission is considering approving permanent lifeguard towers on Laguna Beaches which requires drilling through bedrock, a cement casement, and fiberglass topped structures 12 months out of the year when they will only be used from June — September. Laguna Beach says there is too much sand erosion to use temporary structures, and shifting sand will make towers crooked and unsafe. Ms Siani has alternate designs for temporary lifeguard towers with adjustable legs that would correct any leaning from shifting sand. These alternative designs meet OSHA standards, viewing, access, and crosion standards. Ms. Siani has 9 years of wave records from CDIP showing that during June — September, sand crosion is not a problem anyway. She also has pictures showing that there is easy access to set up temporary towers as they have been doing it for years — access has never been a problem.

Slam believes City of Laguna Beach is pushing this approval hard because they have prepurchased the permanent lifeguard towers and has copies of City budgets back to 2002 showing
allocations of money for this purpose. Commissioners need to realize that granting these permits
not only sets a precedent in the state of California for permanent lifeguard towers, but is also
permitting a total of 30 of these towers as the request is accumulative — 5 more towers will be
added for the next five years.

Ms Siam questions the need for permanent structures when temporary have been satisfactory for over 40 years, are used on the rest of CA beaches, and meet all criteria and needs.
