RE: Emergency Permit Documentation for Emergency Sewerline Fortification at South Carlsbad State Beach.

Dear Ms. Ross,

A staff member observed an exposed 6" ACP (asbestos concrete pipe) forced sewer main at the bluff/beach interface at South Carlsbad State Beach on Thursday August 13th (Attachments A and B; Photos 1 and 2). This sewer line services the South Carlsbad State Beach Campground and Day Use comfort stations. Approximately 47.5 lineal feet of pipe was exposed in two locations. Because a substantial portion of the fill material supporting the pipe has been lost to coastal erosion (most likely from wave action), CSP staff felt that a break in the line was imminent. A decision was made to form a temporary structural repair of the ground supporting and covering the pipe on Thursday August 20th. The project was conducted quickly to avoid the potential of additional erosion and destabilization from several days of above average high tides (greater than 7 feet, beginning Thursday evening).

The work was conducted over two days 11:00 AM to 5:00 PM (Area 2) August 20th and 8:00AM-10:30AM (Area 1) Monday August 24th. A sketch drawing of the pipe reinforcement is shown in Attachment C [the geo-cell as seen in drawing is incorrect, was actually positioned in front of (west) the pipe].

The work entailed (see attached photographs 3-19)

Excavation of about 28" below grade in front of the pipe to key in materials

Relocating 16 pieces of ¼ and ½ ton rock that had migrated onto the beach

Installing 2 units (grids) of composite geo-cell using cobble and fill

And backfilling the pipe and fortification area with approximately 25 cubic yards of fill imported from a sediment basin at Torrey Pines SNR. The repairs were top-dressed with beach cobble.


Access was gained from South Carlsbad State Beach. Two pieces of heavy equipment were used in the repair: a John Deere 644 front loader (on the beach) and a 14-yard dump truck (remained on the road and median).

The cost of the repair was less than \$3,000 in materials and labor.

Additional work is needed to provide protection for this line in the near future. CSP wishes to expeditiously work with the City of Carlsbad and California Coastal Commission to develop a solution that is more sustainable and in accordance with the California Coastal Act.



