Based on project plans and information submitted by the applicant(s) named below regarding the development described below, the Executive Director of the Coastal Commission hereby waives the requirement for a Coastal Development Permit, pursuant to Title 14, Section 13238 of the California Code of Regulations.

APPLICANT: Trinidad Rancheria, Attn: Michael Hostler, Tribal Programs Director

LOCATION: 1 Bay Street at Seascape Rental House, Trinidad, Humboldt County (APN(s) 042-071-08, 042-071-12)

DESCRIPTION: Install a tsunami siren at ground level by: (1) installing the siren on a 4-foot by 4-foot by 6-foot concrete slab in such a manner that the siren facility does not exceed 7 feet in total height; (2) installing a 63-inch, by 24-inch, by 17-inch controller box for remote activation on the Seascape rental house; and (3) mounting a 30-inch by 30-inch Yagi antenna on the Seascape rental to receive the remote activation signal.

RATIONALE: The proposed tsunami siren will be located in a partially paved area that does not contain environmentally sensitive habitat and where the siren will not affect existing public access. The siren has been designed to minimize visual impacts to the scenic Trinidad Harbor by not mounting the siren on a pole. Thus, the proposed project will have no adverse impacts on coastal resources and is consistent with all applicable Chapter 3 policies of the Coastal Act.

IMPORTANT: This waiver is not valid unless the site has been posted AND until the waiver has been reported to the Coastal Commission. This waiver is proposed to be reported to the Commission at the meeting of Friday, June 17, 2011, in Marina Del Rey. If four Commissioners object to this waiver, a coastal development permit will be required.
