State Coastal Conservancy Meeting Report

July 21, 2011



The Coastal Conservancy approved the following:

South Coast

- 1. a grant of \$450,000 to the County of San Diego Department of Parks and Recreation to finalize design and construct a trail as part of the <u>Sweetwater River Trail System</u> in the unincorporated area of Bonita, San Diego County.
- 2. a grant of \$280,000 to the Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority for site improvements and planning activities for public access, community stewardship and educational programs at the <u>Ballona Wetlands Ecological Reserve</u> in Los Angeles County.
- 3. a grant of \$70,000 to the Maritime Museum of San Diego for the <u>Tall Ships Festivals of 2011</u> in San Diego and Orange counties.

Central Coast

- 4. a grant of \$500,000 to the County of San Mateo to purchase and install bathrooms and other access support facilities at the <u>Devil's Slide Coastal Trail</u> and to prepare final plans, specifications, and environmental review and permit documents for a Coastal Trail segment connecting the Devil's Slide Coastal Trail to McNee Ranch State Park and Gray Whale Cove State Beach in northern San Mateo County.
- 5. an Implementation Plan for transfer of two parcels located adjacent to <u>Purisima Creek</u> in San Mateo County to the Coastside Land Trust for open space preservation, natural resource protection and compatible public access; and a grant of \$45,000 to the Coastside Land Trust to construct, operate and maintain public access improvements on these parcels.

San Francisco Bay Area

- 6. a grant of \$250,000 to the County of San Mateo (Department of Public Works, Division of Parks) to improve a 0.84-mile section of the <u>Crystal Springs Regional Trail</u> adjacent to Crystal Springs Reservoir in San Mateo County.
- authorization for the Association of Bay Area Governments to disburse up to \$244,649 of previously granted Conservancy funds to the City of East Palo Alto to construct 0.92 miles of San Francisco Bay Trail spur at <u>Cooley Landing Park</u> in the cities of East Palo Alto and Menlo Park, San Mateo County.
- 8. authorization for the Association of Bay Area Governments to disburse up to \$200,000 of previously granted Conservancy funds to the City of Oakland for the construction of a 0.1-mile San Francisco Bay Trail segment between <u>Fruitvale Avenue and High Street</u> along the Oakland Estuary in Alameda County.

9. a grant of \$68,150 to the Santa Clara County Open Space Authority to construct a segment of the San Francisco Bay Area Ridge Trail in the <u>Sierra Vista Open Space Preserve</u> connecting Santa Clara County Open Space Authority lands to City of San Jose parklands.

North Coast

10. a grant of \$140,000 to the Sotoyome Resource Conservation District to implement Phase I of the <u>Austin Creek Watershed Restoration Program</u> in Southern Sonoma County.

Statewide and General

11. use of \$270,000 for consulting services to assist the Conservancy in maintaining and improving <u>federal support for Conservancy projects</u> and to evaluate proposed federal legislation that would directly affect Conservancy projects.
