State Coastal Conservancy Meeting Report

October 18, 2012



The Coastal Conservancy approved the following:

South Coast

1. a grant of \$1,506,000 to the City of Laguna Beach, Orange County, for acquisition of the 56acre McGehee property adjacent to the <u>Aliso and Wood Canyons Wilderness Park</u> for open space, public access, and habitat preservation.

Central Coast

- 2. a grant of \$1,000,000 to the Monterey Peninsula Regional Park District to acquire the 317acre <u>Whisler Wilson Ranch</u> near Point Lobos, Monterey County, for natural resource protection and public access.
- 3. a grant of \$300,000, including \$100,000 of grant funds from the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, to the City of Santa Barbara to implement <u>fish passage</u> <u>improvements in lower Mission Creek</u> in southern Santa Barbara County.
- 4. a grant of \$40,000 to the California Department of Parks and Recreation to prepare final design, permit, and environmental review documents for the future development of a campground at the <u>Piedras Blancas Motel</u> site within Hearst San Simeon State Park, San Luis Obispo County.

San Francisco Bay Area

- 5. a grant of \$3,189,500, including \$992,000 to be reimbursed by the United States Fish and Wildlife Service National Coastal Wetlands Conservation Program and \$1,232,500 to be reimbursed by the California Department of Water Resources Integrated Regional Water Management Program, to the Sonoma Land Trust for implementation of the <u>Sears Point</u> <u>Wetland and Watershed Restoration Project</u> in Sonoma County.
- 6. a grant of \$750,000 to the East Bay Regional Park District for acquisition of a 1,368-acre property to expand the <u>Pleasanton Ridge Regional Park</u> in Alameda County.
- a grant of \$500,000 to the East Bay Regional Park District for acquisition of up to 51 acres of the 148-acre Pacific Custom Materials Property to expand and improve <u>Carquinez Strait</u> <u>Regional Shoreline</u> between Martinez and Port Costa in unincorporated Contra Costa County.
- 8. a grant of \$750,000 to the Peninsula Open Space Trust for acquisition of a 490-acre property adjacent to <u>Mount Madonna County Park</u> in Santa Clara County.

- 9. a grant of \$250,000 to the Peninsula Open Space Trust for acquisition of a 358-acre property adjacent to <u>Uvas Reservoir County Park</u> near the City of Morgan Hill in unincorporated Santa Clara County.
- 10. a grant of \$500,000 to the City of Richmond, Contra Costa County, to implement a creek daylighting, restoration, and public access greenbelt project at <u>Baxter Creek</u> within the <u>Miraflores Green Housing Project</u>.
- 11. a grant of \$250,000 to The Exploratorium to construct exhibits for the <u>Bay Observatory and</u> <u>Public Promenade</u> at the new Exploratorium location on Piers 15/17 in San Francisco, and to develop future exhibit concepts and a related program series.
- 12. a grant of \$162,000 to Sonoma Land Trust to complete final engineered designs, environmental review, and permitting for three priority fish passage improvements on <u>Stuart</u> <u>Creek</u> and for public access improvements on the Stuart Creek Run property near Glen Ellen, Sonoma County.
- 13. a grant of \$175,000 to the Alameda County Resource Conservation District to plan and implement a minimum of four wildlife-friendly pond restoration projects as part of the Alameda County Wildlife-Friendly Pond Restoration Program.
- 14. a grant of \$125,000 to the East Bay Regional Park District for construction of approximately three miles of the <u>Bay Area Ridge Trail</u> known as <u>Martinez Feeder Trail #1</u> and for surveying of an additional 0.7-mile segment of the same trail, west of the City of Martinez in unincorporated Contra Costa County.
- 15. a grant of \$545,562, including \$465,562 to be reimbursed by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, for a comprehensive program of mercury studies as part of adaptive management of the <u>South Bay Salt Ponds Restoration Project</u> in San Mateo, Santa Clara, and Alameda counties.

North Coast

- 16. a grant of \$2,350,000 to the Crescent City Harbor District to construct a promenade around the Inner Boat Basin, a new approximately half-mile-long section of the <u>California Coastal</u> <u>Trail</u>, and other public access improvements at the <u>Crescent City Harbor</u>, Del Norte County.
- 17. modification of the Conservancy's March 29, 2012, authorization by approval of an additional disbursement of up to \$1,574,000, received by the Conservancy from the California Department of Transportation, to the Marin Agricultural Land Trust for: (a) acquisition of a conservation easement over 204 acres of the 1,194-acre <u>Barboni Ranch</u> in Marin County, (b) pre-acquisition planning activities, and (c) an endowment for the perpetual management of California red-legged frog dispersal habitat on the ranch.

- 18. a grant of \$235,000 to the City of Arcata, Humboldt County, to restore and enhance the <u>McDaniel Slough wetlands</u>.
- 19. adoption of a Mitigated Negative Declaration and Mitigation Monitoring Program for the <u>InterTribal Sinkyone Wilderness Public Trails Project</u> and a grant of \$220,000 to the InterTribal Sinkyone Wilderness Council for implementation of public access improvements in the InterTribal Sinkyone Wilderness, Mendocino County.
- 20. a grant of \$1,362,000 to the City of Fort Bragg, Mendocino County, for the construction of the <u>Ka Kahleh Coastal Trail</u> and associated facilities on <u>Noyo Headlands Park</u>, the former Georgia Pacific Mill Site, for natural resource enhancement on a portion of the site, and for acquisition of the four-acre <u>Johnson Property</u>, anticipated to be the location of a portion of the trail.
- 21. a grant of \$263,000 to the Marin Resource Conservation District to implement habitat enhancement projects in the <u>Tomales Bay Watershed</u> in western Marin County.
- 22. a grant of \$250,000 to the Coastal Ecosystems Institute of Northern California to prepare a sea level rise adaptation plan for the Humboldt Bay Region, Humboldt County.
- 23. a grant of \$78,750 to Save the Redwoods League to complete planning, design, and permitting for a new approximately two-mile section of the <u>California Coastal Trail</u> on the <u>Usal-Shady Dell Creek Property</u> in northern Mendocino County.
- 24. a grant of \$90,000 to the Redwood Community Action Agency to prepare conceptual plans for a new section of the <u>California Coastal Trail</u> from <u>Little River State Beach to Scenic</u> <u>Drive</u> in Humboldt County.

Statewide and General

25. a grant of \$300,000 to Coastwalk California, Inc. to: (a) develop a California Coastal Trail Association, (b) implement the Coastal Trail signing program, and (c) promote public use of and support for the <u>California Coastal Trail</u>.
