The Navy has submitted a negative determination for the dredging of approximately 4,888 cu. yds. of sediments to slightly deepen (by 1-2 ft.) the berthing channel at Pier 5000, on the east side of Point Loma in San Diego Bay. The deepening is needed to accommodate Navy submarines that use Pier 5000. The dredge materials have been tested and are suitable for open ocean disposal, and disposal would be at the EPAapproved offshore dredge disposal site LA-5, located 5.4 nmi. offshore of Pt. Loma. The material is not suitable for beach nourishment. No eelgrass is currently located in the project area; nevertheless the Navy will perform pre- and post construction eelgrass surveys and will assure any eelgrass effects would be mitigated. The dredging would occur outside the least tern nesting season, and the Navy will include monitoring to assure marine mammals and sea turtles would not be affected.

With the measures included, we agree with the Navy's conclusion that the project would avoid adverse effects on coastal zone resources. We therefore concur with your negative determination made pursuant to 15 CFR Section 930.35 of the NOAA implementing regulations. The Coastal Commission staff has reviewed the above-referenced negative determination for implementing the Privatization of Army Lodging (PAL) program at the United States Army Garrison Presidio of Monterey (USAGPOM) in the City of Monterey. Implementation of the PAL program at USAGPOM would involve leasing a 3.95 acre parcel of land with two buildings (Building 366 and 367) to a private development entity (Rest Easy, LLC) to renovate, operate, and maintain the facilities. Buildings 366 and 367 were constructed in 1956 and 1966, respectively, as army lodging facilities. Building 366 is a three-story structure with a basement and 30 rooms, while Building 367 is a two-story structure with no basement and 40 rooms. Rest Easy, LLC would renovate the buildings into a Holiday Inn Express and in-fill the area between the two buildings to provide a front desk, breakfast seating area, fitness room, and business center. The intent of the program is to improve the quality of the lodging facilities for transient users by partnering with a private development entity to manage the facilities under a long-term lease.

Development surrounding the subject parcel includes medical facilities to the west, barracks and lodging to the north, garages and residential housing to the east, and undeveloped land and a parking lot to the south. While the parcel is adjacent to the Presidio of Monterey Historic District, the California's State Historic Preservation Office has determined that no historical properties will be adversely affected through PAL program implementation. The planned renovation will be similar in mass and scale to the existing buildings on the parcel and consistent with the architecture of the surrounding development. The in-fill construction will remove a public view that currently exists between the buildings out to the coast to the east, but the view is not significant as it looks out on an already developed area.

Once the renovations are in place, traffic flow may increase to the area as Rest Easy, LLC would aim to maximize occupancy. However, two parking lots are located on the parcel to support

parking at the new Holiday Inn Express, and the increase in visitation will not exceed the existing road capacity. The Holiday Inn Express will function as a visitor-serving facility open to the public, a high priority use as defined by the Coastal Act. Lastly, no federally listed species or environmentally sensitive habitat areas are located on or adjacent to the subject parcel, and a storm water pollution prevention plan will be implemented during construction to minimize any potential impacts to nearby Monterey Bay.

The Commission staff agrees that the proposed project will not adversely affect coastal zone resources. The Commission staff therefore <u>concurs</u> with your negative determination made pursuant to 15 CFR Section 930.35. Dear Mr. Stalters:

The Coastal Commission staff has reviewed the above-referenced negative determination. The U.S. Coast Guard proposes to replace the Aids to Navigation (ATON) located at the north end of the Channel Islands Harbor Breakwater. The breakwater rocks that support the ATON have shifted due to storm and wave activity, causing the ATON to shift and tilt such that it is now extinguished and is unsafe to service or repair. The Coast Guard proposes to remove the existing ATON, pour a new concrete footing, and install the new ATON on the concrete foundation. The removal and installation work will be completed using a crane on a barge, and is expected to take six days across a four-week work period depending on weather conditions and concrete drying time. The project is currently scheduled to occur in December 2012. The Coast Guard states that while marine mammals are not typically found on the breakwater, the contractor will ensure that a biological monitor is present on the work vessel during all construction activity, and that no work will occur if marine mammals are present on the breakwater.

The Commission staff **agrees** that the proposed project will not adversely affect coastal resources. We therefore <u>concur</u> with your negative determination made pursuant to 15 CFR 930.35 of the NOAA implementing regulations.
