SUBJECT: **Time Extension on the County of Los Angeles Local Implementation Plan No. LCP-4-LAC-14-0109-4, to be heard at the April 10, 2014 Commission Hearing in Santa Barbara.**

On February 19, 2014, the County of Los Angeles submitted a new Local Implementation Plan. On February 21, 2014, the Executive Director determined that the County's submittal was in proper order and legally adequate to comply with the submittal requirements of Coastal Act Section 30510. Pursuant to Section 30513 of the Coastal Act, a proposed Implementation Plan must be scheduled for a public hearing and the Commission must take action within 60 days of a complete submittal. In this case, the 60th day after filing the Implementation Plan submittal complete is April 22, 2014.

Coastal Act Section 30517 and California Code of Regulations Section 13535(c) state that the Commission may extend, for good cause, the 60-day time limit for a period not to exceed one year. Given significant workload constraints, Commission staff is requesting an extension to the 60-day time limit for Commission action. However, Commission staff will endeavor to bring the proposed Implementation Plan forward for Commission action at the June 2014 Commission hearing in Huntington Beach. Therefore, staff recommends that the Commission extend the 60-day time limit to act on the County of Los Angeles Local Implementation Plan No. LCP-4-LAC-14-0109-4 for a period not to exceed one year.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Commission vote to extend the deadline for Commission action for one year.

MOTION: *I move that the Commission extend the 60-day time limit to act on the County of Los Angeles Local Implementation Plan No. LCP-4-LAC-14-0109-4 for one year.*

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends a **YES** vote. An affirmative vote of a majority of the Commission present is needed to pass the motion.
