Installation of directive and warning signage, regarding allowable uses and hazardous bluff conditions, located at the Rockaway Quarry site north of Rockaway Beach in Pacifica, San Mateo County.

Executive Director's Waiver Determination

Pursuant to Title 14, Section 13238 of the California Code of Regulations, and based on project plans and information submitted by the Applicant regarding the proposed development, the Executive Director of the California Coastal Commission hereby waives the requirement for a CDP for the following reasons:

The project includes the installation of 12 directive signs in areas of the site that have been subject to illegal encampments and dumping, trash accumulation, and fire hazards. Signs will be located at each corner of the property, each potential entrance point, and at defined intervals along the perimeter of the site. In addition, 7 warning signs will be installed at entry points where trails may lead to dangerous, unstable areas of the bluff. The project is intended to enhance safe public access to the recreational area and shoreline at this location by assuring appropriate use and warning of hazardous conditions. For these reasons, the project will not result in any adverse impacts on coastal resources and the proposed project is consistent with Chapter 3 of the Coastal Act.

Proposed Development

Habitat restoration involving the removal of non-native, invasive plant species, as well as creosotetreated timbers, along Bolinas Lagoon between Stinson Beach and Fairfax-Bolinas Road, at locations on Highway One from Post Mile 13.75 to 16.5 in Stinson Beach, Marin County.

Executive Director's Waiver Determination

Pursuant to Title 14, Section 13238 of the California Code of Regulations, and based on project plans and information submitted by the Applicant regarding the proposed development, the Executive Director of the California Coastal Commission hereby waives the requirement for a CDP for the following reasons:

The proposed habitat restoration would provide mitigation for a related culvert maintenance project conducted by Caltrans in 2018. Removal of the non-natives will reduce erosion to the lagoon and benefit the shoreline and native plant species present; and removal of the timbers will reduce chemical leaching to the lagoon. Overall, the proposed project provides a net benefit to the Bolinas Lagoon shoreline by improving habitat for native plant species, and water quality by removing chemically-treated timbers. The project will be conducted with hand tools and will not involve any closures to public access parking or recreation areas. For these reasons, the project will not result in any significant adverse impacts to coastal resources, including water quality and public access, consistent with Chapter 3 of the Coastal Act.

Proposed Development

Removal of 137 feet of unpermitted rock revetment and restoration of the shoreline area to its preinstallation condition, fronting two bay side residences at 18555 and 18545 Highway 1, adjacent to Tomales Bay in Marshall, Marin County.

Executive Director's Waiver Determination

Pursuant to Title 14, Section 13238 of the California Code of Regulations, and based on project plans and information submitted by the Applicant regarding the proposed development, the Executive Director of the California Coastal Commission hereby waives the requirement for a CDP for the following reasons:

The proposed project will include removal of two small, unpermitted shoreline protection devices, both 3-feet tall and a total of 137-feet long, as well as site restoration to remove related debris and re-contour the shoreline slope. Best management practices include conducting all work during low tide conditions, operating any heavy equipment inland of the revetment and shore areas, and use of debris catchments at the site perimeter to prevent water quality impacts. All staging and construction activities will minimize encroachment on the tidelands, avoiding impacts on public access and the marine environment. As proposed, the project will not have significant adverse impacts on coastal resources, including public access, water quality, and marine resources, and is therefore consistent with Chapter 3 Coastal Act.
