
Dear Alexis Barrera:

The Jamul Indian Village of California Tribal Historic Preservation Office has received your notification of the project referenced above. This letter constitutes our response on behalf of Erica M. Pinto, Tribal Chairwoman.

We have consulted our maps and determined that the project as described is not within the boundaries of the recognized Jamul Indian Village Reservation. It is, however, within the boundaries of the territory that the tribe considers its Traditional Use Area (TUA). Therefore, we request to be kept in the information loop as the project progresses and would appreciate being maintained on the receiving list for project updates, reports of investigations, and/or any documentation that might be generated regarding previously reported or newly discovered sites. Further, recommend archeological and Kumeayaay Native American monitoring given the proximity of known cultural and historic resources. If the project boundaries are modified to extend beyond the currently proposed limits, we request updated information and the opportunity to respond to your changes.
