I propose the following as a reasonable solution to make both parties happy.

Party #1: The off roaders who attend the park / Party #2: Associated park officials

All two thousand or so acres should be officially opened up (or at least most of it) to make the park safer and more spread out for off roaders who attend. To keep from overcrowding, a group of officials from both parties (like a fire marshal inspects a building) can come out and determine the amount of people who can be in the area at one time, given safety and dust concerns taken into account. Daily passes can be available for purchase. OHV's may be able to drive directly into the park and allowed on outside streets within a small distance of park entrances for the purpose of traveling to and from parked vehicles, homes, or businesses. Posted speed limits in these possible areas shall not exceed 15 mph. Stand alone vehicles and small trailers can be in a designated "parking lot," no campers allowed, and camping spots can be reserved for certain periods of time for larger sums of money. This would limit the amount of off roaders in the park at one time, creating less dust while still maintaining a fun and safe environment. The money can be collected and reinvested into more park staff, who can help pick up trash and enforce safety rules. It could also be reinvested into the parks system, other OHV areas, and/or the surrounding community.

And maybe a website explaining proper dune etiquette? Like spotting, getting un-stuck, etc. And you could also get your passes and reserve camp spots here.

I am no politician, but I think this could be a great start to good graces between both parties. No more fighting.

Dear Secretary Crowfoot:

This letter is being submitted by Friends of Oceano Dunes, Inc. ("Friends"), a California not-for-profit corporation representing users of Oceano Dunes State Vehicle Recreational Area ("ODSVRA"). Friends is deeply concerned by the California Coastal Commission issuing an Emergency Permit (CDP G-3-19-0053) requiring State Parks to immediately close 48 acres of critical camping area ahead of the Christmas and New Year's vacation schedules. State Parks has estimated the loss of these 48 acres to require a reduction of 50% of the camping spaces... yet the closure is happening now and there has been no reduction in camping.

This 48 acre area will not be planted until March, so fencing this area off now makes no logical sense other than to harass the patrons of the Oceano Dunes SVRA and to quite possibly cause injury or death due to overly confined spaces.

We request that State Parks be told to IMMEDIATELY stand down in fencing off these 48 acres until planting is ready to occur and there has been adequate time to inform and educate the users of the park. Safety of the park visitors must not be overlooked.

Dear Secretary Crowfoot,

It has come to the attention of the American Sand Association that California Parks Department is implementing the 48-acre closure at the Oceano Dunes SDVRA now, ahead of the Christmas and New Year's holiday periods. Given that the closure represents a 50% reduction in available camping area, and that camping reservations were sold out prior to the issuance of the Emergency Permit (CCC CDP G-3-19-0053), our concern is that the deadline in the permit, and loss of this camping area will materially compromise the safety and welfare of the visitors to the ODSVRA during the holiday period. We would respectfully request that State Parks be instructed to immediately suspend these closure efforts in order to ensure the safety of the park visitors. We would also request that the fencing deadline be extended until the reservation system has been revised to reflect the new lower capacity.

To Whom it May Concern,

We need your immediate attention to the issues going on at Oceano Dunes. The commission is set to close off riding areas BEFORE the set deadline in March. This early closure before the holidays is creating unsafe conditions. The parks have not reduced the number of reservations for the Christmas-New Year holiday and reservations are completely sold out. This is going to create a disaster, and I suspect death, because they are taking away 48 acres but not reducing the number of registrations. Anyone who is familiar with the riding at Oceano knows that this is a terrible, unsafe, situation. I just don't understand how people in charge to do see how this affects the satefy of riders as well as the economy. Let me give you an example.

I live here but I have family and friends that live in Chico. Every year for the 15 years, we camp at Oceano Dunes for two weeks Christmas through New Years. Our out of town guest list range from 50-75 people with roughly 12-15 trailers each year. Each of these families come with their trailers, trucks, toys, families and kids. We are talking 100K set ups, not cheap. There first stop is Costco in SLO for food. Their second stop is the local gas station down the street from the dunes for water and fuel. Once on the beach and set up, we all spend our first night at Juan's Cantina. We go to Old West Cinnamon rolls to get rolls for Christmas morning. The day after Christmas, all the wives go shopping in Pimso. At least three times during the trip, we go to Splash Cafe for clam chowder. The kids drive into town once or twice to go to the Pismo bowling alley and to spend their Christmas money at Panchos and Esteem. For New Year's Eve, we go to Port San Luis to purchase crab and lobster for a crab feast for 100 people and when they don't have enough we hit the seafood road show at Costco. We ride so much that we have to make multiple trips to the gas station to fill up our tanks. We find ourselves out of light fluid or fire magic dust and have to run to little store on the beach. The kids want stickers from the little store so we get those too. When we pack up, all the kids in camp on the last day are given trash bags and while the adults are closing up camp, all the kids pick up bag fulls of trash and we have a contest and a winner for who picks up the most. It is good wholesome (EXPENSIVE) fun. It is a tradition.

Today, I am texting my family and friends saying our tradition is in jeopady. We are conversating about the closure and the affects of this on camping and riding. We are fearful of the harzardous conditions. We have little kids that want to ride. Is it safe? Should we even go? We have been talking about how this will likely be the last time we camp in Oceano. We are talking about where we will meet up next year. All that money for our economy - gone. We are just one family but I know how much money we all spend for this memory. I love supporting local. But, this is forcing us to think about alternatives. It is going to be a sad day for these businesses. For the economy of Pismo. And the safety of our community.

No one has died from the sand that has been blowing for thousands of years in our area. NOT ONE PERSON. However, I am praying now for the satefy of all riders. There has already been multiple deaths caused by unsafe driving conditions due to the closures that have happened already. I can't imagine what it will be like with another 48 arces gone and no reduction in camping. Please take action. Please support us in our fight to keep Oceano Dunes open so that adults and children can ride in safe conditions during the holidays. It is only fair to keep it open until the agreed upon date in March.

I stand for the sand!
