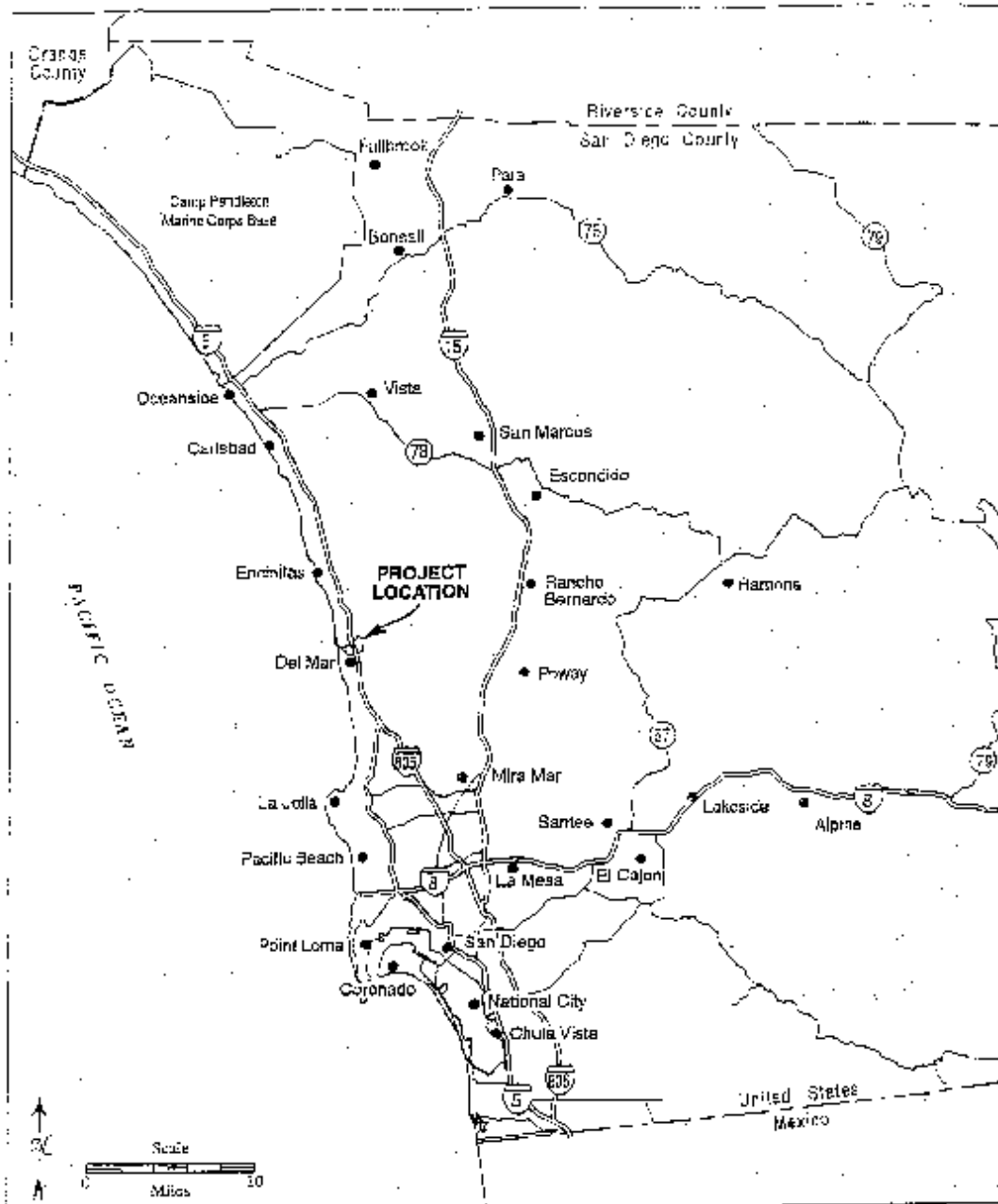

San Dieguito Wetland Restoration Project Regional Location Map

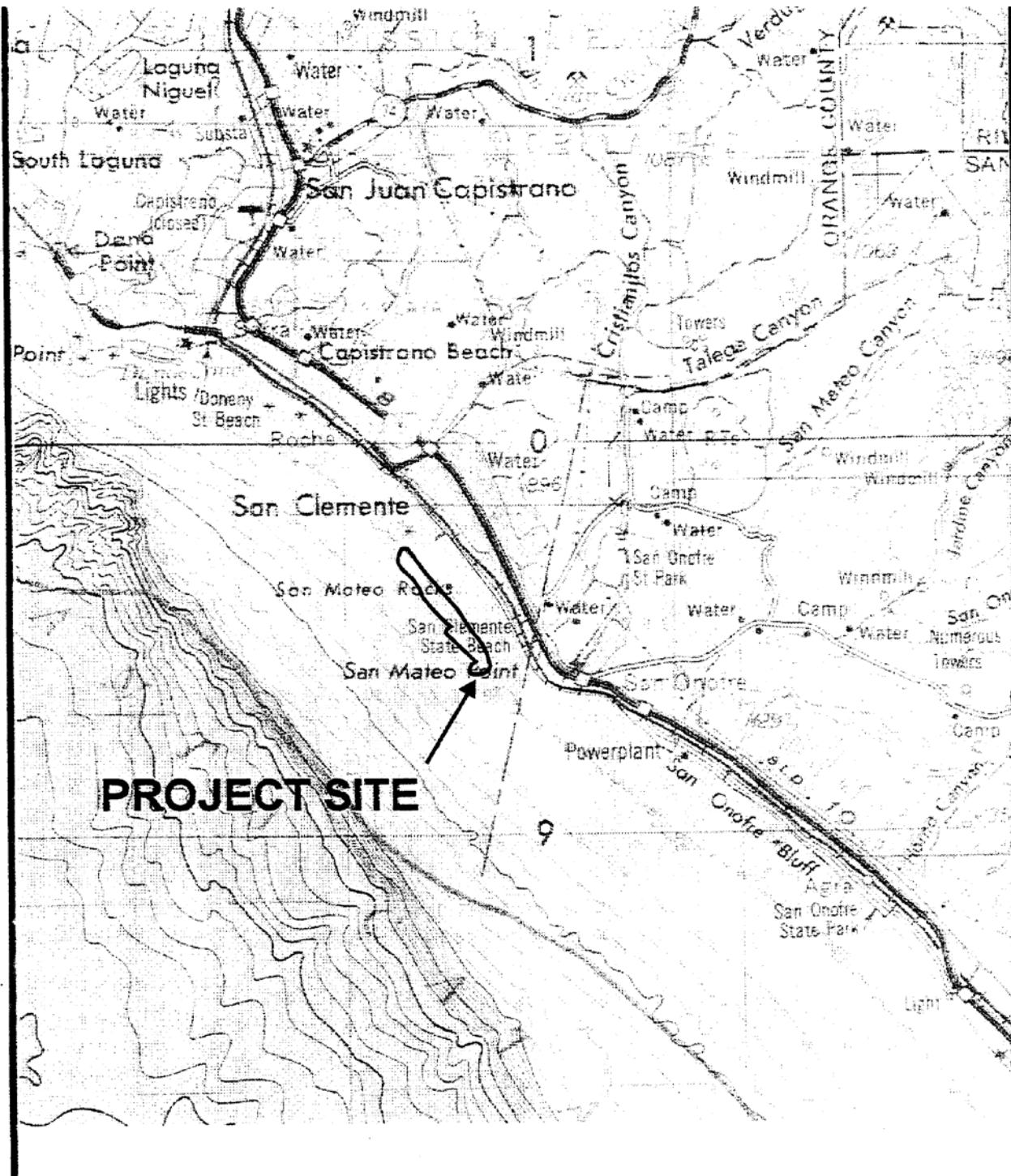

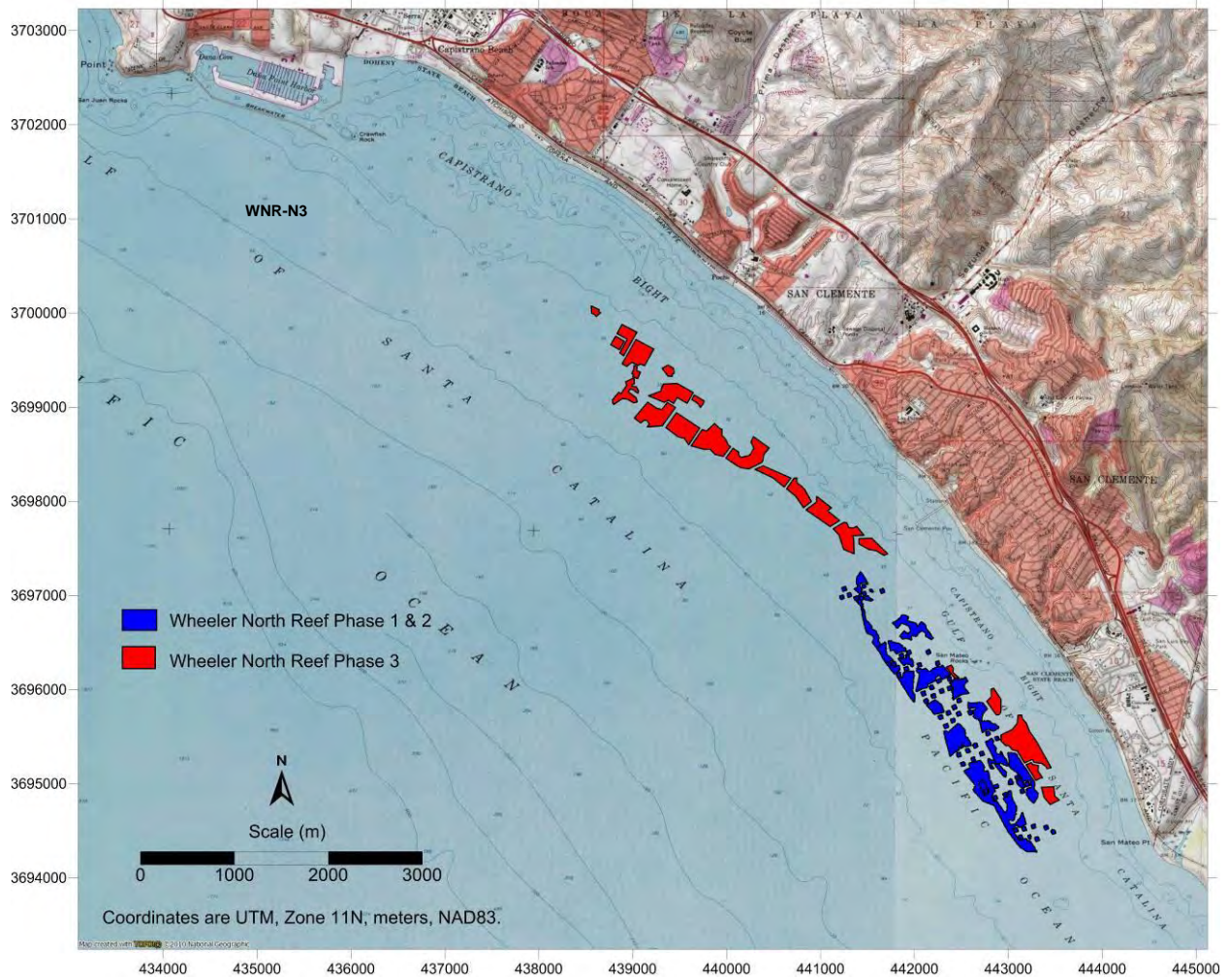


Figure 3-1. Proposed 210.6-acre Phase 3 WNR Expansion (red areas) and existing 176 acre WNR Phase 1&2 (blue areas).

SUBJECT: San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station (SONGS) Marine Mitigation Program: 2022-2023
Two-Year Work Program and Budget

Southern California Edison (SCE) has reviewed the draft work program and budget for the SONGS Marine Mitigation Program and supports your request for its approval by the California Coastal Commission (CCC).

The draft reflects our recent discussions. SCE appreciates your efforts to help us contain the costs of the CCC oversight and monitoring of the mitigation projects as required by our Coastal Development Permit. We also appreciate your efforts to clearly articulate the specific tasks to be undertaken by your contract scientists, the justification for those tasks, and the estimated cost of each.

In total, the proposed work program will cost SCE and the other SONGS owners nearly \$7.5 million over the next two years. We are hopeful that continued collaboration between the respective team members will further economize the work program as it progresses.
