Dear California Coastal Commission,

We live in South Orange County and have been unable to access our local public beach, POCHE, for quite some time now. My family has spent countless summers at POCHE and have loved this special beach for many years. POCHE is conveniently located at the intersection of Camino Capistrano and El Camino Real/PCH on the border of Dana Point and San Clemente.

The pedestrian access has been closed for months now due to the broken catwalk that is in need of repair. From what I understand, the County of Orange has applied to the Coastal Commission for a repair permit of the access way. I was informed that the County is prepared to start repairing the catwalk as soon as this permit is approved.

**DANGER**: We were told, and it is posted on a plastic saw horse situated next to the posted County worker, that we can only access Poche by walking up the shoreline from Pico Beach, which is too far and completely covered with rocks ...OR... by going north to the Capistrano Beach parking and walking back south two miles. The access is then only available if there is not excessive run off from the creek located at Poche (which is why we have a catwalk). It simply isn't feasible. Therefore, as you can imagine, many people simply ignore those two suggestions and WALK OVER THE RAILROAD TRACKS, bringing danger to themselves and family members. I will not effect that option, as I value my life and those of my grandchildren (there is a curve on the tracks and difficult to see the oncoming trains, and yet people still use this hazardous option). Again, the vast majority of beach goers use this dangerous track trespassing option.

**NOTE**: "a man was killed after a train collision near Pacific Coast Highway and Camino Capistrano in San Clemente, on Monday, April 16th, 2018, around 4:00 pm. Ernest Gibson, 71 years old of Elsinore, was attempting to cross the tracks alongside a female pedestrian when the collision occurred, reported the deputies of the Orange County Sheriff's Department."
