SUBJECT: Executive Director's Report, July 2021

Transportation Unit partners with UC Berkeley's Department of City and Regional Planning Summer Research Program

This summer, the Commission's Statewide Transportation Program is partnering with four Masters of City Planning students from UC Berkeley's College of Environmental Design. The students will be providing research assistance on two important topics: 1) a review of case studies in nature-based adaptation solutions and how they might be applied on the California coast, which will build on recent work by the Commission's Statewide Planning unit; and 2) analysis of coastal ecosystems that are most at risk of experiencing 'coastal squeeze,' or an inability to migrate inland as sea level rises, as a result of adjacent state highway infrastructure. This research is being conducted in collaboration with Caltrans Coastal Program staff and will inform the next iteration of Caltrans' State Highway System Management Plan, a ten-year capital improvement needs assessment and investment plan. Staff are grateful for the contributions that the students will make to these two important research topics.
