MRCA Support for October 14, 2022 Agenda Item F14a


Dear Chairwoman Brownsey and Coastal Commissioners,

The Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority's (MRCA) strongly supports item F14a (CDP No. 4-21-0693) and its permit condition to fund construction of a new coastal access staircase at MRCA's Las Tunas Beach (Los Angeles County APNs 4449-007-900, 901, 902, 903, 904) currently known as the Miramar Coastal Overlook in Malibu, California. The proposed new staircase is part of the suite of planned improvements in the proposed Malibu Coastal Access Public Works Plan (Malibu PWP), a joint project of the MRCA and the State Coastal Conservancy, expected to be before the California Coastal Commission soon for your consideration and possible approval.

The proposed Malibu PWP contains public access improvements on many Malibu public properties to promote maximum enjoyment of this 21-miles of the California coast for the almost 20 million residents in the greater Los Angeles metropolitan area, the 40 million California residents and the 15 million annual visitors to Malibu. Currently at Las Tunas Beach, there is existing coastal visual access at the Miramar Coastal Overlook but no beach access is available. The beach staircase is an integral component to advance and maximize this public property for coastal access.

The MRCA looks forward to partnering with the Coastal Commission and Caltrans to satisfy your permit condition at Las Tunas Beach.
