## Public Service Recognition Week & Acknowledgment of Staff Years of Service Milestones.

Last week was Public Service Recognition week. I want to express my deep appreciation and thanks to the Commission staff for their tireless dedicated public service in the protection of our State's precious ocean and coastal resources. We owe a debt of gratitude to all public servants across this nation who have dedicated their lives to public service. In addition, attached to this report is a list of our incredible staff who have reached milestones in their years of service with the Commission. Congratulations and thanks to the Commission staff for your many years of dedicated service to the Commission.

#### 2022 NOAA Coastal Fellow

In April, Commission staff participated virtually as a host agency in the 2022 NOAA Coastal Management Fellowship matching workshop process. After multiple rounds of interviews staff were pleased to match with its new incoming fellow, Liz Plascencia. Liz is a native Californian hailing from Los Angeles, and comes to the Commission with a Master of Environmental Management from Yale University's School of the Environment. Her fellowship project will create resources, training materials, and policy guidance critical for the agency's long-term implementation of its Environmental Justice and Tribal Consultation Policies. Liz will also add capacity to the Commission's ability to carry forward key projects within its climate change and sea level rise planning and regulatory work, particularly with regard to the intersection between environmental justice, climate change, sea level rise planning, and resilience. Staff are thrilled to welcome Liz to the team in early August 2022 for her two-year placement.

#### **Non-Competitive LCP Local Assistance Grants**

In October 2021, in conjunction with additional LCP Grant Program updates, the Commission approved a non-competitive grant application process by which grant proposals for up to \$100,000 could be approved by the Executive Director and announced at the following Coastal Commission meeting. The following non-competitive grants were approved over the past month:

City of Pacific Grove, \$100,000: The City of Pacific Grove will build on past grant work by
completing an updated vulnerability assessment. In particular, the City will fill a data gap by
including new SLR modeling for the Asilomar Dunes area (which was not included in previous
modeling work) and updating older, now out of date SLR modeling for other parts of the City.
Minor updates to the recently certified LCP based on these studies will also be completed,
most likely including an updated coastal hazards map overlay.

#### **Meetings and Events**

#### **CSAC - Coastal Counties Regional Association meeting**

On April 20, Deputy Executive Director, Madeline Cavalieri and I participated in the California State Association of Counties (CSAC) Annual conference - Coastal Counties Regional Association Sub-Meeting. We provided an overview of the Commission's new Climate and Sea Level Rise Resiliency LCP Grant program, including the different types of grants that are available. We also outlined the type of planning studies and efforts that can be covered by the grant program.

#### **State Science and Information Program**

On April 4<sup>th</sup>, staff Senior Ecologist, Dr. Lauren Garske-Garcia, and Energy and Ocean Resources and Federal Consistency Manager, Cassidy Teufel, participated on a California State University Council on Ocean Affairs, Science & Technology (COAST) State Agency Panel for it's <u>State Science Information Needs Program</u>. The RFP for this year's funding was developed with input from our staff and partner agencies, focusing on needs surrounding compensatory mitigation in the coastal and marine environments. The State Agency Panel participates in the review of technical proposals and provides COAST with feedback on their value relative to agency information needs. Previous funding rounds have supported research on microplastics and sea level rise.

#### Adaptive Rotational Grazing and Soil Carbon Sequestration Workshop

On April 21<sup>st</sup>, staff Senior Ecologist, Dr. Lauren Garske-Garcia, participated in the Central Coast Rangelands Coalition's <u>Adaptive Rotational Grazing and Soil Carbon Sequestration Workshop</u> at Paicines Ranch. The gathering brought together over 100 participants from ranching, science, and policy sectors to learn about emerging practices and opportunities in grazing management intended to simultaneously improve soil health, restore native ecosystems, and address climate impacts. As the Commission has approved several projects that involve the strategic use of grazing as a restoration tool, opportunities to expand partnerships and integrate climate benefits while also maintaining coastal agriculture and restoring native ecosystems represent an exciting

avenue our staff is examining.

#### **Butano Forest Health Project Implementation**

On April 29<sup>th</sup>, several staff including Dr. Lauren Garske-Garcia (Senior Ecologist), Dr. Mary Matella (Statewide Environmental Scientist), and Daniel Nathan (Wildfire Resilience Coordinator), joined the San Mateo Resource Conservation District, State Parks, and others to visit the Camp Butano Forest Health project site following its Fall 2021 implementation. This project was not only the first to be completed under one of the Commission-certified Forest Health Public Works Plans, but also the first project *statewide* to be completed under the Board of Forestry's Vegetation Treatment Program (CalVTP) Programmatic EIR. Review of post-treatment on-the-ground conditions highlighted significant progress in simultaneously creating a safer landscape and more resilient native ecosystem in the face of future wildfire risk. Discussion of lessons learned through the implementation process and preview of an adjacent site that will be considered for vegetation treatment in the near future were also valuable components of the day. As a whole, the effort demonstrates the Commission's commitment to ongoing coordination and partnerships on critical wildfire issues in the coastal zone.

#### **Public Education Program**

#### Climate Video Challenge

The results of the Coastal Commission's 2022 <u>Climate Video Challenge</u> were announced on Earth Day. California middle and high school students were invited to respond to the question "What is your vision for a thriving future?" First, second, and third place, and one honorable mention were selected and can be viewed here.

#### **Aquatic Invasive Species Workshop.**

Also on Earth Day, Boating Clean and Green Program staff, along with California Department of Fish and Wildlife and the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service led a Freshwater Aquatic Invasive Species Prevention virtual workshop. Fifty people attended.
