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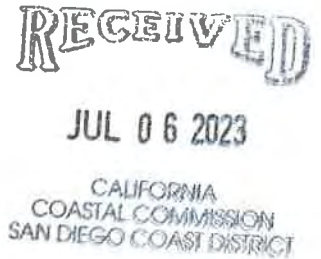

RE: Extension request – replacement of storm drains in South Mission Beach

Dear Hucklebridge,

I have no problem with the extension of the storm drain construction. BUT.

South Mission Beach has put up with six and half years of underground utilities. Completed this January 2023

South Mission Beach is starting year three of the sewer and water replacement. They dug up next to my house seven times. Probably two more years.

My complaint is the moratorium during the summer. They stop the projects in mid May and then do not start again until mid to late September. So the people who lived down at the beach get extra months added on to the project. I understand that work should be banned on the weekend. But work could be completed Monday thru Friday. Since I work out of my house in South Mission Beach. There is not that much traffic midweek. It stops at Belmont and Bonita Cove parking lots.

Plus now with the city and Coastal allowing short term rental year around. Are you going to stop construction year round for the 1100 extra short term rental in the winter??????????

Since I am now complaining. Who decided to let the elementary school redevelopment use pavers in the alley of the new construction with a protective layer of protection on the sand. That layer could tear in fifteen years. Then you would have oil and brake asbestos seeping thru the paver separation. The sea water travels under the residences in Mission Beach. At the school. The water table is four feet from the surface. Mission Bay is 100- to 200 feet away from the bay.. Should have been concrete. Like every other alley in Mission Beach. Not a good decision. You had my protest letter at the time. I mentioned it to staff at the meeting about my letter. They know me.

A little tidbit of information. I am in the Philippines six months a year. Your agenda is blocked on the internet in the Philippines. But I have a VPN that hides my location. So I can still see if any new houses are being put on the agenda in Mission Beach. So I can contact your staff. Your staff is great. I miss saying hi to Alex and Diana (retired)during the pandemic.
