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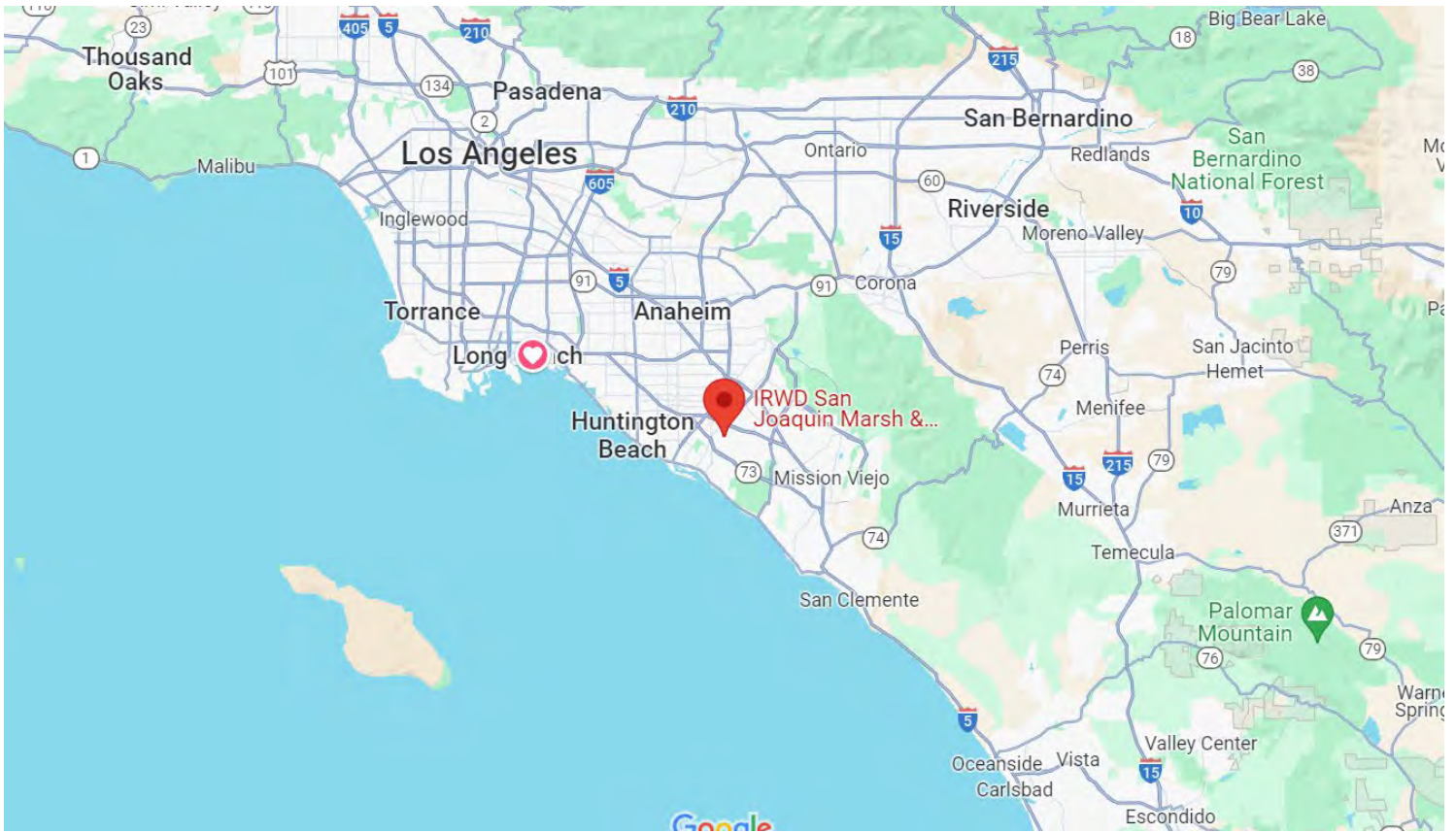
Exhibit 1 – Vicinity Map/Site Plan

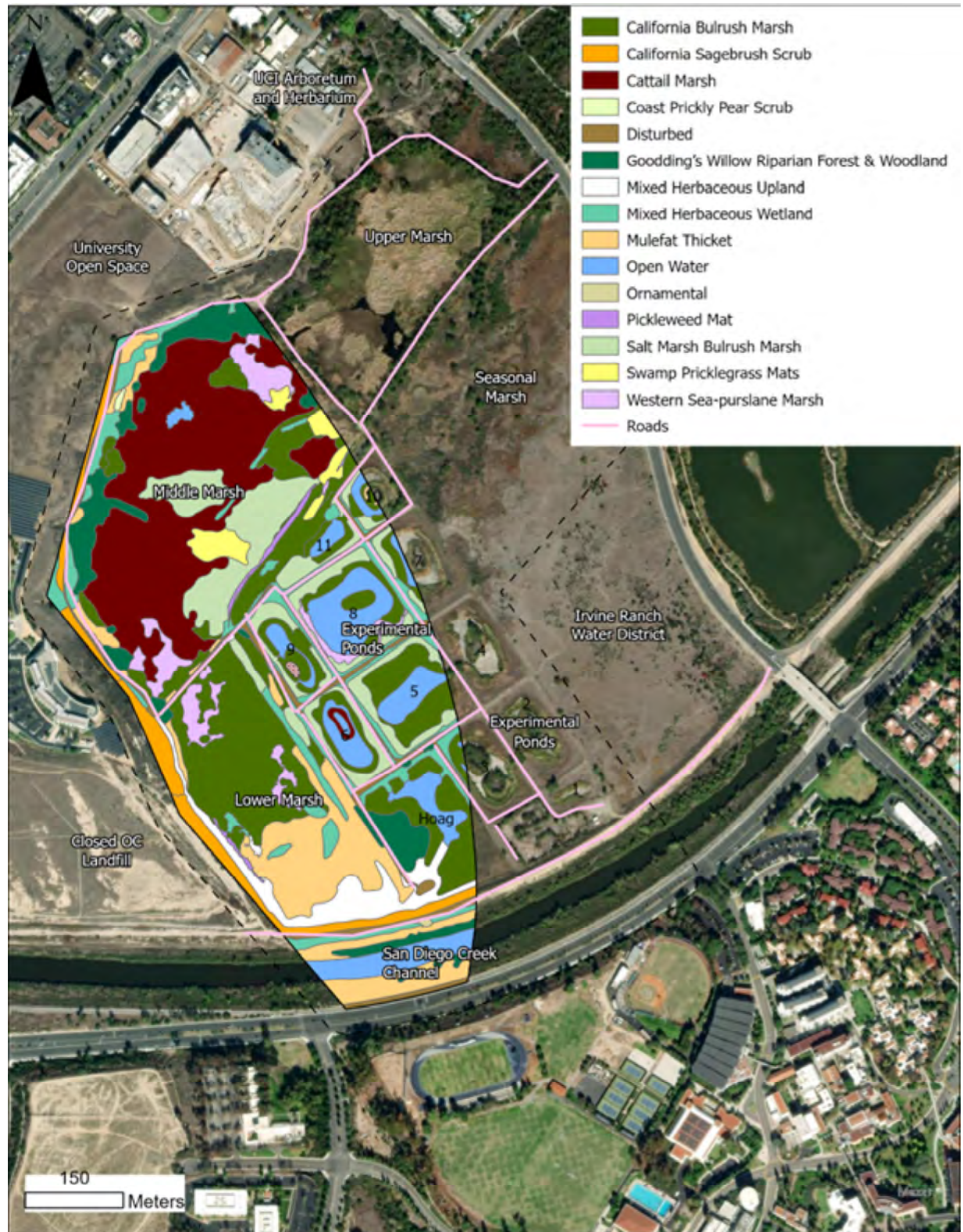

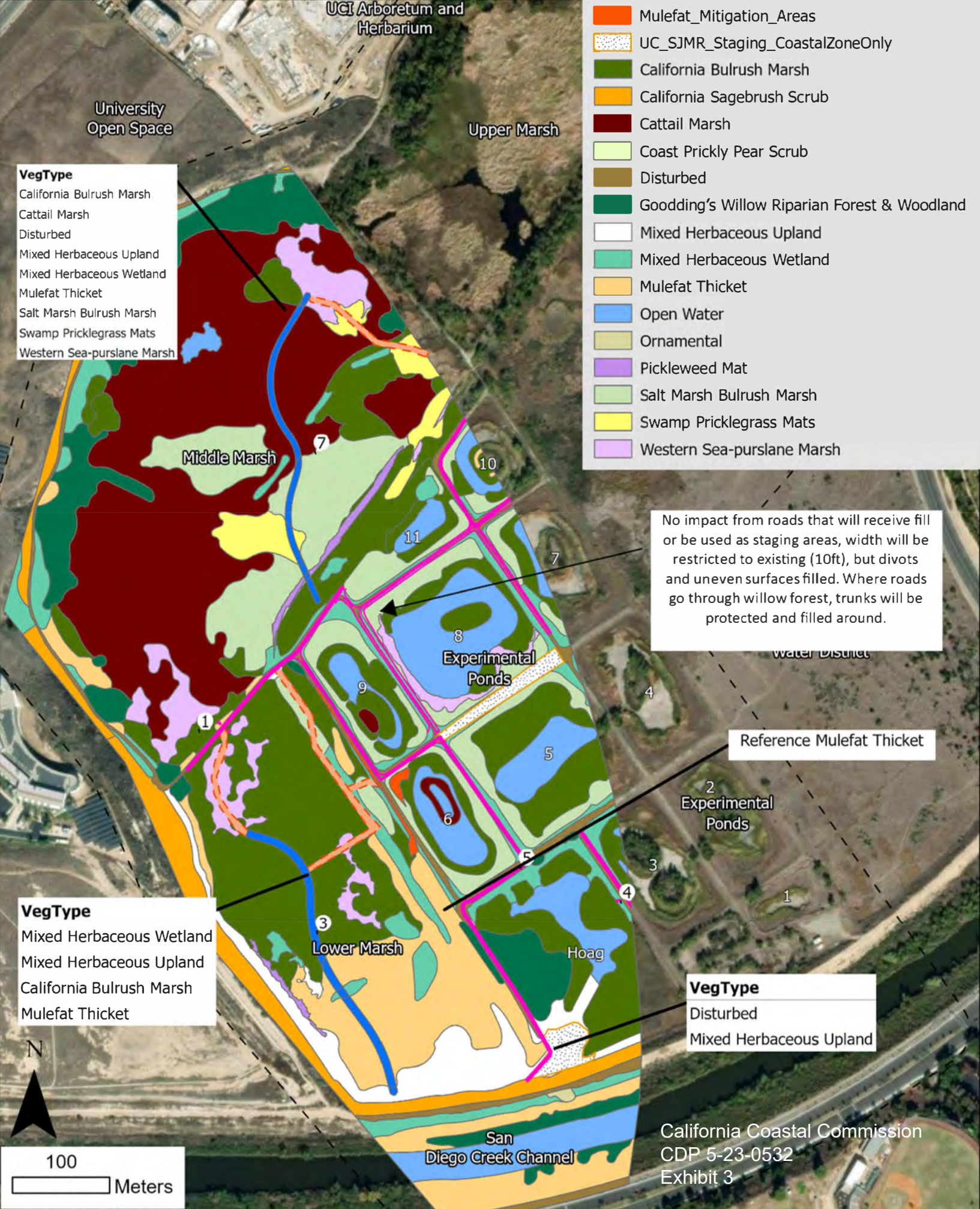

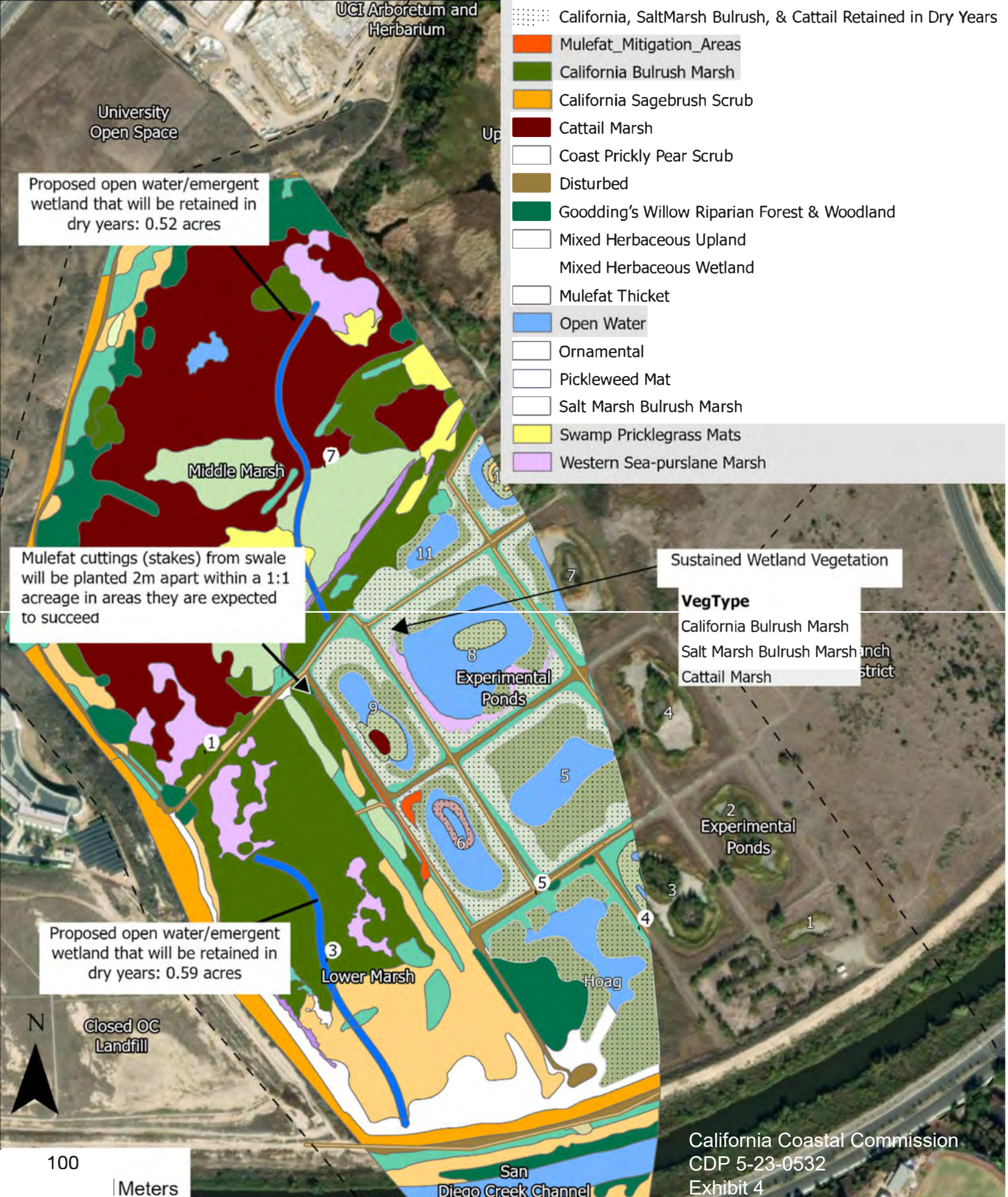




Map of currently existing marsh areas, vegetation communities, and existing roads



San Joaquin Marsh Reserve Summary of Proposed Impacts



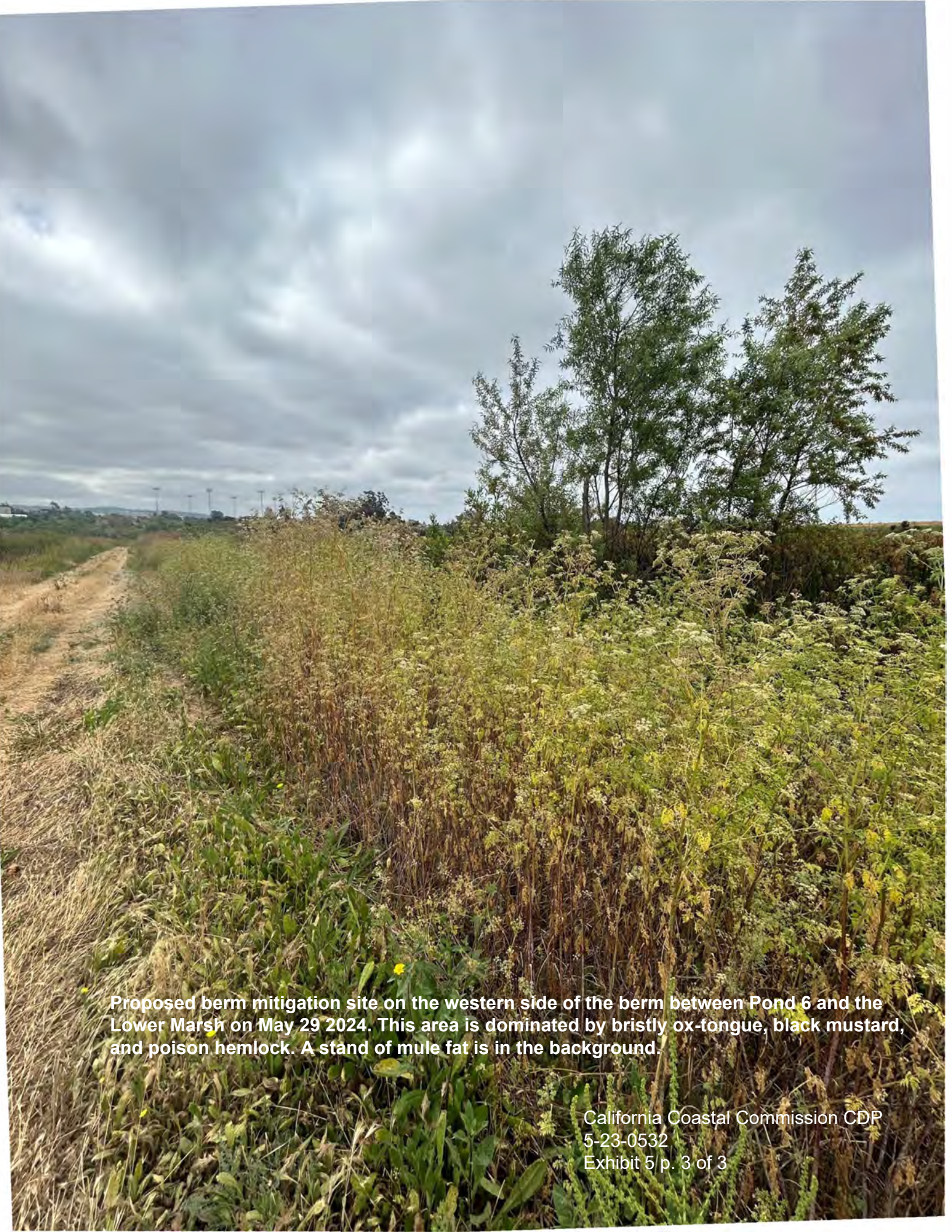
Desired Conditions:

Proposed pond mitigation site on the northwest corner of Pond 6 on May 29 2024. Visible is bare ground, non-native grasses including bromes and rabbitfoot, bristly ox-tongue, and sparse salt marsh bulrush.



Proposed berm mitigation site on the western side of the berm between Pond 6 and the Lower Marsh on May 29 2024. This area is dominated by bristly ox-tongue, black mustard, and poison hemlock. A stand of mule fat is in the background.
